- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 15, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 6 amended by adding Article 15.251 to read as follows:
- 7 Art. 15.251. NO-KNOCK WARRANT. (a) In this article,
- 8 "no-knock entry" means a peace officer's entry, for the purpose of
- 9 executing a warrant, into a building or other place without giving
- 10 notice of the officer's authority or purpose before entering.
- 11 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a magistrate may
- 12 <u>not issue a warrant under this chapter that authorizes a no-knock</u>
- 13 entry.
- 14 (c) A district court judge may issue a warrant under this
- 15 chapter that authorizes a no-knock entry if the complaint is
- 16 submitted concurrently with a statement that approves the use of a
- 17 no-knock entry and that is signed by the chief administrator of the
- 18 law enforcement agency employing the affiant.
- 19 SECTION 2. Chapter 18, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 20 amended by adding Article 18.025 to read as follows:
- 21 Art. 18.025. NO-KNOCK WARRANT. (a) In this
- 22 article, "no-knock entry" has the meaning assigned by Article

- 24 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (c), a magistrate may

- 3 (c) A district court judge may issue a warrant under this
- 4 chapter that authorizes a no-knock entry if the affidavit under
- 5 Article 18.01(b) is submitted concurrently with a statement that
- 6 approves the use of a no-knock entry and that is signed by the chief
- 7 administrator of the law enforcement agency employing the affiant.
- 8 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 9 to a warrant issued on or after the effective date of this Act. A
- 10 warrant issued before the effective date of this Act is governed by
- 11 the law in effect on the date the warrant was issued, and the former
- 12 law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 13 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
