## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- relating to the sale of fireworks on and before the Juneteenth 2
- holiday in certain counties. 3
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4
- SECTION 1. Section 2154.202(g), Occupations 5 is
- amended to read as follows: 6
- 7 Except as provided by Subsection (h), a retail fireworks
- permit holder may sell fireworks only to the public, and only during 8
- 9 periods:

- beginning June 14 and ending at midnight on June 19 10 (1)
- in a county in which the commissioners court of the county has 11
- approved the sale of fireworks during the period; 12
- 13 (2) beginning June 24 and ending at midnight on July 4;
- 14 (3)  $[\frac{(2)}{(2)}]$  beginning December 20 and ending at midnight
- on January 1 of the following year; and 15
- (4) [(3)] beginning May 1 and ending at midnight on 16
- May 5 if the fireworks are sold at a location that is not more than 17
- 100 miles from the Texas-Mexico border and that is in a county in 18
- which the commissioners court of the county has approved the sale of 19
- 20 fireworks during the period.
- 21 SECTION 2. Sections 352.051(b) and (d), Local Government
- Code, are amended to read as follows: 22
- 23 (b)(1) The Texas A&M Forest Service in the ordinary course
- of its activities shall determine whether drought conditions, as 24

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- 1 defined under Subsection (a)(2), exist on average in any county
- 2 requesting such a determination. The Texas A&M Forest Service
- 3 shall make available the measurement index guidelines used to
- 4 determine whether drought conditions exist in a particular area.
- 5 Following any determination that such drought conditions exist, the
- 6 Texas A&M Forest Service shall notify said county or counties when
- 7 such drought conditions no longer exist. The Texas  $\underline{A\&M}$  Forest
- 8 Service shall make its services available each day during the Texas
- 9 Independence Day, San Jacinto Day, Memorial Day, Juneteenth, Fourth
- 10 of July, and December fireworks seasons to respond to the request of
- 11 any county for a determination whether drought conditions exist on
- 12 average in the county.
- 13 (2) The Texas A&M Forest Service shall be allowed to
- 14 take such donations of equipment or funds as necessary to aid in the
- 15 carrying out of this section.
- 16 (d) To facilitate compliance with an order adopted under
- 17 Subsection (c), the order must be adopted before:
- 18 (1) February 15 of each year for the Texas
- 19 Independence Day fireworks season;
- 20 (2) April 1 of each year for the San Jacinto Day
- 21 fireworks season;
- 22 (3) April 25 of each year for the Cinco de Mayo
- 23 fireworks season;
- 24 (4) May 15 of each year for the Memorial Day fireworks
- 25 season;
- 26 (5) June 1 of each year for the Juneteenth fireworks
- 27 season;

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- 1 (6) June 15 of each year for the Fourth of July
- 2 fireworks season; and
- 3 (7) [(6)] December 15 of each year for each December
- 4 fireworks season.
- 5 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 6 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 7 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 8 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 9 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
