5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 531, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 531.024442 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 531.024442. MEDICAID BUY-IN PROGRAM FOR CERTAIN
8	PERSONS WITH INCREASED HOUSEHOLD INCOME FROM EMPLOYMENT. (a) In
9	this section, "small business" means a business with an annual
10	gross revenue of \$850,000 or less.
11	(b) The commission shall operate a Medicaid buy-in program
12	for Medicaid recipients:
13	(1) who are not eligible for a Medicaid buy-in program
14	established under Section 531.02444; and
15	(2) whose eligibility for Medicaid is otherwise being

terminated solely because of an increase in household income

- 19 identical to the Medicaid buy-in programs for persons with
- 20 disabilities established under Section 531.02444, except to the
- 21 extent that programmatic differences are appropriate because of the
- 22 populations served by the programs.

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- 23 (d) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules for
- 24 participation in the program under this section that provide for:

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- 1 (1) eligibility requirements, including household
- 2 income limits for participation; and
- 3 (2) requirements for program participants to pay
- 4 premiums or cost-sharing payments.
- 5 SECTION 2. Not later than January 1, 2022, the executive
- 6 commissioner of the Health and Human Services Commission shall
- 7 adopt the rules required by Section 531.024442, Government Code, as
- 8 added by this Act, and the commission shall implement the program
- 9 required by that section.
- 10 SECTION 3. If before implementing any provision of this Act
- 11 a state agency determines that a waiver or authorization from a
- 12 federal agency is necessary for implementation of that provision,
- 13 the agency affected by the provision shall request the waiver or
- 14 authorization and may delay implementing that provision until the
- 15 waiver or authorization is granted.
- SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
