- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Sections 33.25(a) and (b), Tax Code, are amended
- 7 (a) After a seizure of personal property, the collector
- 8 shall make a reasonable inquiry to determine the identity and to
- 9 ascertain the address of any person having an interest in the
- 10 property other than the person against whom the tax warrant is
- 11 issued. The collector shall provide in writing the name and address
- 12 of each other person the collector identifies as having an interest
- 13 in the property to the peace officer charged with executing the
- 14 warrant. The peace officer shall deliver as soon as possible a
- 15 written notice stating the time and place of the sale and briefly
- 16 describing the property seized to the person against whom the
- 17 warrant is issued and to any other person having an interest in the
- 18 property whose name and address the collector provided to the peace
- 19 officer. The posting of the notice and the sale of the property
- 20 shall be conducted:
- 21 (1) [in a county other than a county to which
- 22 Subdivision (2) applies, by the peace officer in the manner
- 23 required for the sale under execution of personal property; or
- 24 [(2) in a county having a population of three million or

1 more:

- $[\frac{A}{A}]$ by the peace officer or collector, as
- 3 specified in the warrant, in the manner required for the sale under
- 4 execution of personal property; or
- 5 (2) [(B)] under an agreement authorized by Subsection
- 6 (b).
- 7 (b) The commissioners court of a county [having a population
- 8 of three million or more] by official action may authorize a peace
- 9 officer or the collector for the county charged with selling
- 10 property under this subchapter by public auction to enter into an
- 11 agreement with a person who holds an auctioneer's license to
- 12 advertise the auction sale of the property and to conduct the
- 13 auction sale of the property. The agreement may provide for on-line
- 14 bidding and sale.
- 15 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply only to
- 16 an ad valorem tax sale of personal property seized under a tax
- 17 warrant issued on or after the effective date of this Act. An ad
- 18 valorem tax sale of personal property seized under a tax warrant
- 19 issued before the effective date of this Act is governed by the law
- 20 in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 21 that law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 22 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
