BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 155, Occupations Code, is
amended by adding Section 155.108 to read as follows:
Sec. 155.108. LICENSE FOR MILITARY VETERAN TO PRACTICE IN
CERTAIN AREAS. (a) In this section, "active duty" and "armed
forces of the United States" have the meanings assigned by Section
<u>55.001.</u>
(b) The board shall issue a license to practice medicine in
a location described by Subsection (e) to an applicant who:
(1) is licensed in good standing as a physician in
another state;
(2) is a veteran of the armed forces of the United
States who retired from or otherwise left military service not more
than one year before the application date for a license under this
section; and
(3) was, at the time of retiring from or leaving
military service:
(A) serving on active duty in this state; and
(B) authorized as a physician to treat persons
enlisted in the armed forces of the United States or veterans.
(c) An applicant for a license under this section is not
