10	(2) a resident who is blind as defined by Section
11	355.001 [94.001], <u>Labor</u> [Human Resources] Code;
12	(3) a resident or nonresident who is under 17 years
13	old; or
14	(4) a resident who is at least 65 years old but younger
15	than 85 years old or \underline{a} nonresident who is 65 years old or over.
16	(c) The commission shall waive the fee for $\underline{:}$
17	(1) a qualified disabled veteran as defined by Section
18	42.012 <u>;</u>
19	(2) [and for] a resident on active duty as a member of
20	the United States military forces, the Texas Army National Guard,
21	the Texas Air National Guard, or the Texas State Guard;
22	(3) a resident who is under 17 years old and who has a
23	disability; and

(4) a resident who is 85 years old or over.

- 1 SECTION 2. (a) The change in law made by this Act applies
- 2 only to a fee charged for a fishing license issued on or after the
- 3 effective date of this Act.
- 4 (b) A fishing license issued before the effective date of
- 5 this Act is covered by the law in effect when the license was
- 6 issued, and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 7 The Parks and Wildlife Department is not required to issue a refund
- 8 for any license issued before the effective date of this Act.
- 9 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
