UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY HEALTH CARE PROVIDER 13 SECTION 3. Section 105.001, Occupations Code, is amended to 14 read as follows: Sec. 105.001. DEFINITION. In this subchapter [chapter], 15 16 "health care provider" means a person who furnishes services under a license, certificate, registration, or other authority issued by 17 this state or another state to diagnose, prevent, alleviate, or 18 cure a human illness or injury. 19 SECTION 4. Chapter 105, Occupations Code, is amended by 20 21 adding Subchapter B to read as follows: SUBCHAPTER B. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT BY MENTAL HEALTH PROVIDER 22 23 Sec. 105.051. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter: 24 (1) "Child" means an individual younger than 18 years

2	(2) "Gender identity or expression" means a person's
3	having, or being perceived as having, a gender-related identity,
4	appearance, expression, or behavior, whether or not that identity,
5	appearance, expression, or behavior is different from that commonly
6	associated with the person's assigned sex at birth.
7	(3) "Mental health provider" means:
8	(A) a behavior analyst licensed under Chapter

10	(B) a chemical dependency counselor licensed

12	(C) a licensed professional counselor licensed

14	(D) a marriage and family therapist licensed
15	under Chapter 502;

Sec. 105.052. UNPROFESSIONAL CONDUCT. (a) A mental health 1 provider engages in unprofessional conduct if, in the course of 2 providing services to a child, the mental health provider attempts 3 4 to: 5 (1) change the child's sexual orientation, including 6 by attempting to change the child's behavior or gender identity or 7 expression; or 8 (2) eliminate or reduce the child's sexual or romantic 9 attractions or feelings toward individuals of the same sex. 10 (b) Subsection (a) does not apply to counseling that: (1) provides acceptance, support, and understanding 11 of a child or facilitates a child's coping, social support, and 12 identity exploration and development, including sexual 13 14 orientation-neutral interventions to prevent or address unlawful 15 conduct or unsafe sexual practices, if that counseling does not seek to change sexual orientation or gender identity or expression; 16 17 or (2) provides support to a child undergoing gender 18 19 transition in accordance with established standards of care. (c) A mental health provider who commits unprofessional 20 conduct under Subsection (a) is subject to disciplinary action by 21 any state regulatory entity with the power to take disciplinary 22 action against that mental health provider. 23 24 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
