Sections 276.013(a) and (b), Election Code, are amended to read as follows: 6 7 (a) A person commits an offense if the person knowingly or intentionally makes any effort to: 8 9 (1)influence the independent exercise of the vote of another in the presence of the ballot or during the voting process; 10 11 (2) cause a voter to become registered, a ballot to be 12 obtained, or a vote to be cast under false pretenses; [or] 13 (3) count invalid votes that the person knows to be 14 invalid or alter a report to include invalid votes that the person knows to be invalid; 15 16 (4) fail to count valid votes that the person knows to be valid or alter a report to exclude valid votes that the person 17 knows to be valid; or 18 <u>(5)</u> [<del>(3)</del>] cause intentionally misleading 19 any statement, representation, or information to be provided: 20 21 (A) to an election official; or 22 (B) on an application for ballot by mail, carrier 23 envelope, or any other official election-related form or document. 24 (b) An offense under this section is a felony of the second

1 <u>degree</u> [Class A misdemeanor].

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
