A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

- 2 relating to the adoption of a healthy and safe school water plan by
 3 public schools.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 38, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 38.038 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 38.038. HEALTHY AND SAFE SCHOOL WATER PLAN. (a) In
- 8 this section, "water source" means any running water tap that is
- 9 used for drinking or food preparation.
- 10 (b) Each school district shall adopt a healthy and safe
- 11 school water plan. The plan must include provisions for:
- 12 (1) periodic testing for lead in school water sources;
- 13 <u>and</u>

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- 14 (2) reducing exposure to elevated levels of lead in
- 15 <u>school water sources.</u>
- 16 (c) If the results of a school water source test for lead
- 17 show a level of lead that exceeds 15 parts per billion, the school
- 18 district must restrict access to the water source within 48 hours of
- 19 <u>learning of the test results.</u> The district must determine and
- 20 mitigate the source of the lead contamination, and a subsequent
- 21 test for lead must show a level of lead below 15 parts per billion
- 22 before access to the water source is returned to normal.
- 23 (d) The agency, in collaboration with the Texas Commission
- 24 on Environmental Quality, the Department of State Health Services,

- 1 regional education service centers, and other stakeholders, shall
- 2 develop a model healthy and safe school water plan that may be used
- 3 by a school district to comply with this section.
- 4 (e) To the extent that funds are available to the agency for
- 5 the purpose, the agency shall develop a program under which the
- 6 agency reimburses a school district for testing lead concentrations
- 7 <u>in water sources at the district.</u>
- 8 SECTION 2. (a) Not later than December 31, 2021, the Texas
- 9 Education Agency shall develop the model healthy and safe school
- 10 water plan required by Section 38.038, Education Code, as added by
- 11 this Act.
- 12 (b) Not later than September 1, 2022, each school district
- 13 and open-enrollment charter school shall adopt a healthy and safe
- 14 school water plan as required by Section 38.038, Education Code, as
- 15 added by this Act, and Section 12.104(b)(3)(K), Education Code, as
- 16 applicable.
- 17 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 18 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 19 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 20 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 21 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
