3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

4 SECTION 1. Section 64.034, Election Code, is amended to

5 read as follows:

6 Sec. 64.034. OATH. A person selected to provide assistance

7 to a voter must take the following oath, administered by an election

8 officer at the polling place, before providing assistance:

9 "I swear (or affirm) under penalty of perjury that I will not

10 suggest, by word, sign, or gesture, how the voter should vote; I

11 will confine my assistance to answering the voter's questions, to

12 stating propositions on the ballot, and to naming candidates and,

13 if listed, their political parties; I will prepare the voter's

14 ballot as the voter directs; I did not encourage, pressure, coerce,

15 or intimidate the voter into choosing me to provide assistance; and

16 I am not the voter's employer, an agent of the voter's employer, or

17 an officer or agent of a labor union to which the voter belongs."

18 SECTION 2. Chapter 276, Election Code, is amended by adding

19 Section 276.017 to read as follows:

20 Sec. 276.017. PERJURY IN CONNECTION WITH CERTAIN VOTING

21 PROCEDURES. (a) A person commits an offense if the person makes a

22 false statement when making the oath described by Section 64.034 or

23 swears to the truth of a false statement previously made when making

24 the oath described by Section 64.034.

- (b) An offense under this section is a Class A misdemeanor
 except that the punishment for an offense under this section is a
 state jail felony if it is shown on the trial of the offense that the
- 4 person made a false statement under Subsection (a) three or more
- 5 times in connection with any election in a four-year period.
- 6 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 7 to an offense committed on or after the effective date of this Act.
- 8 An offense committed before the effective date of this Act is
- 9 governed by the law in effect on the date the offense was committed,
- 10 and the former law is continued in effect for that purpose. For
- 11 purposes of this section, an offense was committed before the
- 12 effective date of this Act if any element of the offense occurred
- 13 before that date.
- 14 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
