- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter E, Chapter 67, Education Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 67.72 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 67.72. TEXNET TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE. (a) In
- 8 this section, "program" means the TexNet seismic monitoring program
- 9 administered by the bureau.
- 10 (b) The TexNet Technical Advisory Committee is established
- 11 as an advisory committee within the bureau.
- 12 <u>(c) The advisory committee consists of nine members</u>
- 13 appointed by the governor who work or reside in this state,
- 14 including:
- 15 (1) one representative of the Railroad Commission of
- 16 Texas who specializes in seismology, geomechanical engineering,
- 17 reservoir engineering, or another related field recommended to the
- 18 governor by the executive director of the Railroad Commission of
- 19 Texas; and
- 20 (2) at least three representatives from the oil and
- 21 gas industry, not to include the representative appointed under
- 22 Subdivision (1).
- 23 (d) The governor shall designate a member of the advisory
- 24 committee as the chair of the advisory committee to serve in that

1 capacity at the pleasure of the governor. 2 (e) A person affiliated with the bureau or under contract 3 for services with the bureau may not serve as a voting member of the 4 advisory committee. 5 (f) The director of the bureau shall serve, ex officio, as a nonvoting member of the advisory committee. 6 7 (g) The advisory committee shall: (1) in coordination with the bureau, develop 8 recommendations for a program of work to assist the program and any 9 10 research efforts affiliated with the program in accomplishing the goals of the program, including recommendations regarding: 11 12 (A) the acquisition and deployment of equipment; (B) contracting with vendors; 13 14 (C) determining the scope of research programs 15 associated with the program; and 16 (D) determining the scope of any use of funds 17 appropriated by the legislature for the program or associated 18 research; 19 (2) review and approve or reject expenditures made in connection with the program; 20 21 (3) prepare and approve an annual budget for the use of 22 any funds appropriated for the program by the legislature; (4) provide oversight and input on the acquisition, 23

the Incorporated Research Institutions for Seismology database;

deployment, and operation of new and existing program equipment;

(5) ensure that there is a monthly transmission of the

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1 and 2 (6) meet with the bureau quarterly to discuss the progress of the program, expenditures made in connection with the 3 program, and any other information related to the program that the 4 5 advisory committee finds necessary. 6 (h) Not later than December 31 of each even-numbered year, the advisory committee and the bureau jointly shall prepare and 7 8 submit to the governor, the lieutenant governor, and the speaker of the house of representatives a report that includes: (1) a review of the use of any funds appropriated for 10 the program by the legislature; 11 12 (2) a complete listing and accounting of all research funded through the program, including: 13 14 (A) a list of contractors employed under the 15 program; 16 (B) an itemized budget for each program element; 17 and 18 (C) a list of the geographic coverage of the 19 program; and 20 (3) recommendations related to the ongoing operations

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and requirements of the program.

SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
