A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

- 2 relating to the use of certain data collected by the Texas Workforce
- 3 Commission to determine general prevailing wage rates for certain
- 4 public work contracts.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. Section 2258.022(a), Government Code, is amended
- 7 to read as follows:
- 8 (a) For a contract for a public work awarded by a political
- 9 subdivision of the state, the public body shall determine the
- 10 general prevailing rate of per diem wages in the locality in which
- 11 the public work is to be performed for each craft or type of worker
- 12 needed to execute the contract and the prevailing rate for legal
- 13 holiday and overtime work by:
- 14 (1) conducting a survey of the wages received by
- 15 classes of workers employed on projects of a character similar to
- 16 the contract work in the political subdivision of the state in which
- 17 the public work is to be performed; [or]
- 18 (2) using the prevailing wage rate as determined by
- 19 the United States Department of Labor in accordance with the
- 20 Davis-Bacon Act (40 U.S.C. Section 3141 [276a] et seq.), and its
- 21 subsequent amendments; or
- 22 (3) using data compiled by the Texas Workforce
- 23 Commission's Labor Market and Career Information Department,
- 24 including occupational employment statistics wage data for:

- 1 (A) the local workforce development area or
- 2 metropolitan statistical area relating to the locality in which the
- 3 public work is performed; or
- 4 (B) the state, but only if there is no data
- 5 available for the relevant local workforce development area or the
- 6 metropolitan statistical area for the specific occupation, as
- 7 <u>classified by the United States Bureau of Labor Statistics in the</u>
- 8 2018 Standard Occupational Classification system, for which data is
- 9 sought.
- 10 SECTION 2. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 11 to a public work contract entered into or renewed on or after the
- 12 effective date of this Act.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
