administers the immunization or vaccination.

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- 1 (b) The board shall establish minimum education and
- 2 continuing education standards for a pharmacist who orders or
- 3 administers an immunization or vaccination. The standards must
- 4 include Centers for Disease Control and Prevention training, basic
- 5 life support training, and hands-on training in techniques for

- 27 or [influenza] vaccination to a patient who is at least three [over

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- 1 seven] years of age without an established physician-patient
- 2 relationship if the immunization or vaccination is:
- 3 (1) authorized or approved by the United States Food
- 4 and Drug Administration or listed in the routine immunization
- 5 schedule recommended by the federal Advisory Committee on
- 6 Immunization Practices published by the federal Centers for Disease
- 7 Control and Prevention; and
- 8 (2) ordered or administered in accordance with the
- 9 federal Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices
- 10 vaccine-specific recommendations.
- 11 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
