- 1 cyberbullying, skills to manage emotions, establishing and
- 2 maintaining positive relationships, and responsible

- 4 (iii) suicide prevention, including

- 6 (C) physical education;
- 7 (D) fine arts;
- 8 (E) career and technology education;
- 9 (F) technology applications;
- 10 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew
- 11 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on
- 12 history and literature; and
- 13 (H) personal financial literacy.
- 14 SECTION 2. This Act applies beginning with the 2021-2022
- 15 school year.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 17 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 18 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 19 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 20 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
