A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to required cardiopulmonary resuscitation training for

- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 1701.3071, Occupations Code, is amended
- 6 by adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 7 (a-1) The training required by Subsection (a)(2) must
- 8 include telecommunicator cardiopulmonary resuscitation training
- 9 that:
- 10 (1) uses the most current nationally recognized
- 11 emergency cardiovascular care guidelines;
- 12 (2) incorporates recognition protocols for
- 13 out-of-hospital cardiac arrest; and
- 14 (3) provides information on best practices for
- 15 relaying compression-only cardiopulmonary resuscitation
- 16 instructions to callers.
- SECTION 2. Section 1701.352(i), Occupations Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 (i) A state agency, county, special district, or
- 20 municipality that appoints or employs a telecommunicator shall
- 21 provide training to the telecommunicator of not less than 20 hours
- 22 during each 24-month period of employment that includes:
- 23 (1) telecommunicator cardiopulmonary resuscitation as
- 24 described by Section 1701.3071(a-1); and

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- (2) other [. The training must be approved by the commission and commission and the employing entity.

 SECTION 3. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the Texas Commission on Law Enforcement shall adopt rules necessary to implement Section 1701.3071(a-1), Occupations Code, as added by this Act, and Section 1701.352(i), Occupations Code, as amended by this Act.
- 9 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
