1AN ACT2relating to the selection of public members to serve on a county's3salary grievance committee.4BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 152.015, Local Government Code, is 6 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (d) and adding 7 Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:

8 (a) The public members of the salary grievance committee 9 shall be selected <u>as provided by Subsection (b) or (b-1)</u> at a 10 meeting of the <u>commissioners</u> court at any time during the year, but 11 not later than the 15th day after the date a request for a hearing is 12 received under Section 152.016(a). If a request for a public 13 hearing is not received, the commissioners court is not required to 14 select public members.

Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), before [Before] 15 (b) 16 the meeting required by Subsection (a), the county clerk shall place on a separate slip the name of each person who served on a 17 grand jury in the county during the preceding calendar year. At the 18 meeting the slips shall be folded, placed in an appropriate 19 20 container, and mixed. The county judge shall draw at random a number 21 of slips equal to the number of public members needed for the committee and shall announce the names on the slips. At the meeting 22 23 the county judge may repeat this process and make a list of 24 alternates.

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1 (b-1) As an alternative to the process prescribed by 2 Subsection (b), the commissioners court may direct the county clerk 3 to use a computer to generate a randomized list of the names of all 4 persons who served on a grand jury in the county during the 5 preceding calendar year. At the meeting required by Subsection (a), 6 the commissioners court shall:

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(1) adopt the randomized list;

8 (2) enter the list into the minutes of the meeting; and 9 (3) select, in the order of the list, the necessary 10 number of public members and alternates.

(b-2) A person whose name is selected under this section 11 [drawn] becomes a member of the committee or an alternate on 12 submitting written acceptance of the selection to the clerk. If a 13 14 person refuses or is unable to serve on the committee, a replacement 15 shall be appointed from the list of alternates. If the list of alternates is exhausted or does not exist, a replacement shall be 16 17 selected from the remaining names not already selected, in the same manner as the replaced member, at the next regular or called 18 19 commissioners court meeting [by random selection of a slip from the 20 remaining slips]. This process shall be repeated until the required number of public members <u>have accepted the selection</u> [is selected]. 21

(d) A vacancy in a public member position shall be filled for the unexpired part of the term by appointment from the list of alternates. If the list of alternates is exhausted or does not exist, a replacement shall be <u>selected</u> [filled by random selection of a slip] from the remaining <u>names not already selected</u>, in the <u>same manner as the vacating member</u>, [slips] at a meeting of the

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1 commissioners court.

2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
