A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

2 relating to the selection of public members to serve on a county's

- 3 salary grievance committee.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 152.015, Local Government Code, is
- 6 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), and (d) and adding
- 7 Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:
- 8 (a) The public members of the salary grievance committee
- 9 shall be selected as provided by Subsection (b) or (b-1) at a
- 10 meeting of the $\underline{\text{commissioners}}$ court at any time during the year, but
- 11 not later than the 15th day after the date a request for a hearing is
- 12 received under Section 152.016(a). If a request for a public
- 13 hearing is not received, the commissioners court is not required to
- 14 select public members.
- 15 (b) Except as provided by Subsection (b-1), before [Before]
- 16 the meeting required by Subsection (a), the county clerk shall
- 17 place on a separate slip the name of each person who served on a
- 18 grand jury in the county during the preceding calendar year. At the
- 19 meeting the slips shall be folded, placed in an appropriate
- 20 container, and mixed. The county judge shall draw at random a number
- 21 of slips equal to the number of public members needed for the
- 22 committee and shall announce the names on the slips. At the meeting
- 23 the county judge may repeat this process and make a list of
- 24 alternates.

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- 1 (b-1) As an alternative to the process prescribed by
- 2 Subsection (b), the commissioners court may direct the county clerk
- 3 to use a computer to generate a randomized list of the names of all
- 4 persons who served on a grand jury in the county during the
- 5 preceding calendar year. At the meeting required by Subsection (a),
- 6 the commissioners court shall:
- 7 (1) adopt the randomized list;
- 8 (2) enter the list into the minutes of the meeting; and
- 9 (3) select, in the order of the list, the necessary
- 10 number of public members and alternates.
- 11 <u>(b-2)</u> A person whose name is <u>selected under this section</u>
- 12 [drawn] becomes a member of the committee or an alternate on
- 13 submitting written acceptance of the selection to the clerk. If a
- 14 person refuses or is unable to serve on the committee, a replacement
- 15 shall be appointed from the list of alternates. If the list of
- 16 alternates is exhausted or does not exist, a replacement shall be
- 17 selected from the remaining names not already selected, in the same
- 18 $\underline{\text{manner}}$ as the replaced $\underline{\text{member}}$, at the next regular or called
- 19 commissioners court meeting [by random selection of a slip from the
- 20 remaining slips]. This process shall be repeated until the required
- 21 number of public members $\underline{\text{have accepted the selection}}$ [is selected].
- 22 (d) A vacancy in a public member position shall be filled
- 23 for the unexpired part of the term by appointment from the list of
- 24 alternates. If the list of alternates is exhausted or does not
- 25 exist, a replacement shall be <u>selected</u> [filled by random selection
- 26 of a slip] from the remaining names not already selected, in the
- 27 same manner as the vacating member, [slips] at a meeting of the

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- 1 commissioners court.
- 2 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
