## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to warning labels for opioid prescription drugs.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 481.074(a), Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) A pharmacist may not:
- 7 (1) dispense or deliver a controlled substance or
- 8 cause a controlled substance to be dispensed or delivered under the
- 9 pharmacist's direction or supervision except under a valid
- 10 prescription and in the course of professional practice;
- 11 (2) dispense a controlled substance if the pharmacist
- 12 knows or should have known that the prescription was issued without
- 13 a valid patient-practitioner relationship;
- 14 (3) fill a prescription that is not prepared or issued
- 15 as prescribed by this chapter;
- 16 (4) permit or allow a person who is not a licensed
- 17 pharmacist or pharmacist intern to dispense, distribute, or in any
- 18 other manner deliver a controlled substance even if under the
- 19 supervision of a pharmacist, except that after the pharmacist or
- 20 pharmacist intern has fulfilled his professional and legal
- 21 responsibilities, a nonpharmacist may complete the actual cash or
- 22 credit transaction and delivery; [or]
- 23 (5) permit the delivery of a controlled substance to
- 24 any person not known to the pharmacist, the pharmacist intern, or

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- 1 the person authorized by the pharmacist to deliver the controlled
- 2 substance without first requiring identification of the person
- 3 taking possession of the controlled substance, except as provided
- 4 by Subsection (n); or
- 5 (6) dispense a prescription opioid unless the bottle
- 6 or container in which the opioid is dispensed is affixed with a
- 7 <u>label warning of the addictive nature of opioids and the risks of</u>
- 8 overdose as required by board rule under Section 481.0761(1).
- 9 SECTION 2. Section 481.0761, Health and Safety Code, is
- 10 amended by adding Subsection (1) to read as follows:
- 11 (1) The board shall adopt rules requiring that all
- 12 prescription opioids be dispensed in a bottle or container affixed
- 13 with a label warning users of the addictive nature of opioids and
- 14 the risk of overdose. The label must include language substantially
- 15 <u>similar to the following:</u>
- "CAUTION: Opioid. Risk of Overdose and Addiction.".
- 17 SECTION 3. The Texas State Board of Pharmacy shall adopt the
- 18 rules required under Section 481.0761(1), Health and Safety Code,
- 19 as added by this Act, not later than January 1, 2022.
- SECTION 4. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 21 to a prescription for an opioid dispensed on or after March 1, 2022.
- 22 A prescription dispensed before March 1, 2022, is governed by the
- 23 law in effect immediately before the effective date of this Act, and
- 24 the former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 25 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 26 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 27 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this

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- 1 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 2 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
