- 2 relating to a joint study and report by the Texas Education Agency
- 3 and the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board regarding the

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 7 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 29, Education Code, is
- 8 amended by adding Section 29.0114 to read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 29.0114. STUDY REGARDING TRANSITION TO HIGHER
- 10 EDUCATION FOR STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES. (a) In this section,
- 11 "coordinating board" means the Texas Higher Education Coordinating
- 12 Board.
- 13 (b) The agency and the coordinating board jointly shall
- 14 conduct a study on the transition to higher education for public
- 15 school students with disabilities.
- 16 (c) The study must investigate and identify:
- 17 <u>(1)</u> the percentage of students enrolled in a special
- 18 <u>education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, who graduate high</u>
- 19 school;
- 20 (2) the percentage of students enrolled in a special
- 21 education program under Subchapter A, Chapter 29, who following
- 22 high school graduation enroll in a public or private institution of
- 23 higher education;
- 24 (3) for each disability category identified by the

- 1 Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (20 U.S.C. Section 1400
- 2 et seq.):
- 3 (A) appropriate supports and services for a
- 4 student who is eligible for services based on that category of
- 5 disability to facilitate the student's transition to higher
- 6 education; and
- 7 (B) whether students eligible for services based
- 8 on that category of disability currently receive the supports and
- 9 services identified under Paragraph (A);
- 10 (4) barriers that exist for students with disabilities
- 11 to transition to higher education;
- 12 (5) whether services and accommodations for students
- 13 with disabilities who enroll in public or private institutions of
- 14 higher education are accessible; and
- 15 (6) whether students with disabilities currently
- 16 receive sufficient and accurate information regarding their civil
- 17 rights.
- 18 (d) Not later than September 1, 2022, the agency and the
- 19 coordinating board shall prepare a report detailing the results of
- 20 the study under this section and submit to the legislature the
- 21 report and any recommendations for legislative or other action.
- (e) This section expires January 1, 2023.
- 23 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
