A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to the confidentiality of certain government operated utility customer information. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 4 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter C, Chapter 552, Government Code is amended by adding new Section 552.161 to read as follows: 6 Sec. 552.161. EXCEPTION: CONFIDENTIALITY OF 7 CERTAIN GOVERNMENT OPERATED UTILITY CUSTOMER INFORMATION. (a) In this 8 9 section: (1) "Advanced metering system" means any metering 10 system that collects periodic data at regular intervals through the 11 12 use of an automated wireless or radio network. 13 (2) "Government-operated utility" has the meaning 14 assigned by Section 182.051(3), Utilities Code. (b) Information is excepted from the requirements of 15 Section 552.021, Government Code, if it is information maintained 16 by a government-operated utility that: 17 18 (1) discloses whether services have been discontinued or are eligible for disconnection by the government-operated 19 utility; or 20 21 (2) is collected as part of an advanced metering system for usage, services, and billing, including, amounts billed 22 23 or collected for utility usage, except that all such information is to be made available to that customer or their designated 24

1 <u>representative</u>.

(c) The exception to public disclosure created by this section is in addition to any exception created by Section 552.101, Government Code, including information made confidential by law pursuant to Section 182.052, Utilities Code. Public access to customer billing information covered by 552.101, Government Code, is denied to the extent provided by that section.

8 SECTION 2. Section 182.052(a), (b), (c), and (d), Utilities 9 Code, is amended to read as follows:

10 (a) Except as provided by Section 182.054, а government-operated utility may not disclose personal information 11 12 in a customer's account record, or any information relating to the volume or units of utility usage or the amounts billed to or 13 14 collected from the individual for utility usage, unless if the 15 customer requests that the government-operated utility disclose such information keep the information confidential. 16 However, a 17 government-operated utility may disclose information related to the customer's volume or units of utility usage per billing cycle or 18 amounts billed to or collected from the individual for utility 19 usage if the primary source of water for such utility was a 20 sole-source designated aquifer. 21

(b) A customer may request <u>disclosure of the information</u> <u>under Subsection (a)</u> <u>confidentiality</u> by delivering to the government-operated utility an appropriately marked form provided under Subsection (c)(3) or any other written request for <u>disclosure</u> confidentiality.

(c) A government-operated utility shall include with a bill

1 sent to each customer or on its website:

2 (1) a notice of the customer's right to request
3 disclosure confidentiality under this subchapter; and

4 (2) a statement of the amount of any fee applicable to
5 the request; and

6 (3) (2) a form by which the customer may request
7 <u>disclosure</u> confidentiality by marking an appropriate box on the
8 form and returning it to the government-operated utility <u>by mail or</u>
9 <u>electronically</u>.

10 (d) A customer may rescind a request for <u>disclosure</u> 11 confidentiality by providing the government-operated utility 12 written <u>request to treat such</u> permission to disclose personal 13 information <u>as confidential from and after the date the</u> 14 <u>government-operated utility receives such written request</u>.

SECTION 3. Section 182.053, Utilities Code, is repealed.
SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
Act takes effect September 1,2021.
