## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to law enforcement policies and procedures regarding body
- 3 worn cameras.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as the "Botham Jean Act."
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 1701.655, Occupations Code, is amended
- 7 by amending Subsection (b) and adding Subsection (c-1) to read as
- 8 follows:
- 9 (b) A policy described by Subsection (a) must ensure that a
- 10 body worn camera is activated only for a law enforcement purpose and
- 11 must include:
- 12 (1) guidelines for when a peace officer should
- 13 activate a camera or discontinue a recording currently in progress,
- 14 considering the need for privacy in certain situations and at
- 15 certain locations;
- 16 (2) provisions relating to data retention, including a
- 17 provision requiring the retention of video for a minimum period of
- 18 90 days;
- 19 (3) provisions relating to storage of video and audio,
- 20 creation of backup copies of the video and audio, and maintenance of
- 21 data security;
- 22 (4) provisions relating to the collection of a body
- 23 worn camera, including the applicable video and audio recorded by
- 24 the camera, as evidence;

- 1 (5) guidelines for public access, through open records
- 2 requests, to recordings that are public information;
- (6) (5) provisions entitling an officer to access
- 4 any recording of an incident involving the officer before the
- 5 officer is required to make a statement about the incident;
- (7) [(6)] procedures for supervisory or internal
- 7 review; and
- 8 (8)  $\left[\frac{(7)}{(7)}\right]$  the handling and documenting of equipment
- 9 and malfunctions of equipment.
- 10 <u>(c-1)</u> A policy described by Subsection (a) must require a
- 11 peace officer who is equipped with a body worn camera and actively
- 12 participating in an investigation to keep the camera activated for
- 13 the entirety of the officer's active participation in the
- 14 investigation unless the camera has been deactivated in compliance
- 15 with that policy.
- SECTION 3. Section 1701.657(b), Occupations Code, is
- 17 amended to read as follows:
- 18 (b) A peace officer equipped with a body worn camera may
- 19 choose not to activate a camera or may choose to discontinue a
- 20 recording currently in progress for any [nonconfrontational]
- 21 encounter with a person that is not related to an investigation [au
- 22 including an interview of a witness or victim].
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
