A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT 2 relating to healthy relationships education in public schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 28, Education Code, is 4 5 amended by adding Section 28.0041 to read as follows: Sec. 28.0041. HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION. (a) 6 this section, "age-appropriate" means suitable to particular ages 7 or age groups of children or adolescents, based on developing 8 cognitive, emotional, and behavioral capacity typical for the age 9 10 or age group. 11 (b) A school district shall provide healthy relationships education in accordance with this section at grade levels and in 12 courses specified by the State Board of Education. 13 14 (c) The State Board of Education by rule shall adopt the essential knowledge and skills for curricula to be used by a school 15 16 district in providing healthy relationships education under this section that are age-appropriate and supported by research that is 17 peer-reviewed, conducted in compliance with accepted scientific 18 methods, and recognized as accurate by leading professional 19 organizations and agencies with relevant experience. As 20 age-appropriate, the curricula must promote relationship, 21

- 18 (g) Before each school year, a school district shall provide
- 19 written notice to a parent or legal guardian of each student
- 20 enrolled in the district of the intent to provide healthy
- 21 relationships education under this section. The notice must
- 22 include:

- 24 relationships education to be provided to the student;
