13	requirements of Section 169.004; and
14	(3) the physician certifies to the department that:
15	(A) the patient is diagnosed with:
16	(i) epilepsy;
17	(ii) a seizure disorder;
18	<pre>(iii) multiple sclerosis;</pre>
19	(iv) spasticity;
20	<pre>(v) amyotrophic lateral sclerosis;</pre>
21	<pre>(vi) autism;</pre>
22	(vii) terminal cancer; [ <del>or</del> ]
23	(viii) an incurable neurodegenerative

- 1 (ix) post-traumatic stress disorder; and
- 2 (B) the physician determines the risk of the
- 3  $\operatorname{medical}$  use of  $\operatorname{low-THC}$  cannabis by the patient is reasonable in
- 4 light of the potential benefit for the patient.
- 5 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
