AN ACT

2 relating to prescription drug price disclosure; authorizing a fee;
3 providing an administrative penalty.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 441, Health and Safety
Code, is amended by adding Section 441.0003 to read as follows:

Sec. 441.0003. RULES. The executive commissioner may adopt
rules to implement this chapter.

9 SECTION 2. Chapter 441, Health and Safety Code, is amended 10 by adding Subchapter B, and a heading is added to that subchapter to 11 read as follows:

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SUBCHAPTER B. PRESCRIPTION DRUG PRICE DISCLOSURE

SECTION 3. Section 441.0002, Health and Safety Code, is transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 441, Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, redesignated as Sections 441.0051, 441.0052, 441.0053, and 441.0054, Health and Safety Code, and amended to read as follows:

18 Sec. <u>441.0051</u> [441.0002]. ANNUAL REPORT [DISCLOSURE OF DRUG PRICING INFORMATION]. [(a)] Not later than the 15th day of 19 each calendar year, a pharmaceutical drug manufacturer shall submit 20 a report to the department [executive commissioner] stating the 21 current wholesale acquisition cost information for the United 22 23 States Food and Drug Administration-approved prescription drugs sold in or into this state by that manufacturer. 24

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Sec. 441.0052. PRESCRIPTION DRUG 1 PRICE INFORMATION INTERNET WEBSITE. [(b)] The department [executive commissioner] 2 shall develop an Internet website to provide to the general public 3 prescription drug price information submitted under 4 Section 441.0051 [Subsection (a)]. The Internet website shall be made 5 available on the <u>department's</u> [Health and Human Services 6 Commission's] Internet website with a dedicated link that is 7 8 prominently displayed on the home page or by a separate easily identifiable Internet address. 9

Sec. 441.0053. PRESCRIPTION DRUG COST INCREASE REPORT AND 10 <u>INFORMATION.</u> (a) [(c)] This subsection applies only to a 11 prescription drug with a wholesale acquisition cost of at least 12 \$100 for a 30-day supply before the effective date of an increase 13 described by this subsection. Not later than the 30th day after the 14 15 effective date of an increase of 40 percent or more over the preceding three calendar years or 15 percent or more in the 16 17 preceding calendar year in the wholesale acquisition cost of a drug to which this subsection 18 prescription applies, а pharmaceutical drug manufacturer shall submit a report to the 19 executive commissioner. The report must include the following 20 21 information:

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(1) the name of the prescription drug;

(2) whether the <u>prescription</u> drug is a brand name or
generic;

(3) the effective date of the change in wholesale
 acquisition cost; and

27 (4) [aggregate, company-level research and

1 development costs for the most recent year for which final audit data is available; 2 [(5) the name of each of the manufacturer's 3 prescription drugs approved by the United States Food and Drug 4 5 Administration in the previous three calendar years; 6 [(6) the name of each of the manufacturer's prescription drugs that lost patent exclusivity in the United 7 8 States in the previous three calendar years; and $\left[\frac{(7)}{1}\right]$ a statement regarding the factor or factors that 9 caused the increase in the wholesale acquisition cost and an 10 explanation of the role of each factor's impact on the cost. 11 (b) If during a calendar year a prescription drug with a 12 wholesale acquisition cost of at least \$100 for a 30-day supply 13 14 increases in price by 40 percent or more over the preceding three 15 calendar years or 15 percent or more in the preceding calendar year in the wholesale acquisition cost of the prescription drug, the 16 17 pharmaceutical drug manufacturer must include in the annual report submitted under Section 441.0051 the following information: 18 (1) aggregate, company-level research and development 19 costs for the most recent year for which final audit data is 20 21 available; 22 (2) the name of each of the manufacturer's prescription drugs approved by the United States Food and Drug 23 24 Administration in the previous three calendar years; and (3) the name of each of the manufacturer's 25 26 prescription drugs that lost patent exclusivity in the United 27 States in the previous three calendar years.

1 (c) [(d)] The quality and types of information and data that 2 a pharmaceutical drug manufacturer submits to the <u>department</u> 3 [executive commissioner] under <u>Subsections (a) and (b)</u> [Subsection 4 (c)] must be consistent with the quality and types of information 5 and data that the manufacturer includes in the manufacturer's 6 annual consolidated report on Securities and Exchange Commission 7 Form 10-K or any other public disclosure.

Sec. 441.0054. PUBLICATION OF COST INCREASE INFORMATION. 8 Not later than the 60th day after receipt of the report 9 [(e)] submitted under Section 441.0051 or 441.0053(a) [Subsection (c)], 10 the <u>department</u> [executive commissioner] shall publish the cost 11 12 increase information required by Section 441.0053 [report] on the department's prescription drug price information [Health and Human 13 14 Services Commission's] Internet website [described by Subsection 15 (b)].

16 [(f) The executive commissioner may adopt rules to 17 implement this section.]

18 SECTION 4. Subchapter B, Chapter 441, Health and Safety 19 Code, as added by this Act, is amended by adding Section 441.0055 to 20 read as follows:

21 <u>Sec. 441.0055. FEE. (a) A pharmaceutical drug</u> 22 <u>manufacturer shall submit a fee in the amount provided by</u> 23 <u>department rule with each report submitted under this subchapter.</u>

24 (b) The executive commissioner by rule shall set the fee in 25 the amount necessary for the department to administer this chapter, 26 not to exceed \$400.

27 SECTION 5. Chapter 441, Health and Safety Code, is amended

1	by adding Subchapter C to read as follows:
2	SUBCHAPTER C. ENFORCEMENT
3	Sec. 441.0101. RIGHT TO CORRECT. (a) If the department
4	determines that a pharmaceutical drug manufacturer failed to submit
5	a report or fee required under, or failed to submit the report or
6	fee in the manner prescribed by, Subchapter B and the rules adopted
7	under this chapter, the department shall provide written notice of
8	the failure to the manufacturer.
9	(b) On receipt of notice described by Subsection (a), a
10	pharmaceutical drug manufacturer shall submit, as applicable:
11	(1) a report that:
12	(A) complies with Subchapter B and rules adopted
13	under this chapter; and
14	(B) addresses the issues raised in the notice; or
15	(2) the fee required by Section 441.0055.
16	(c) The department may not assess an administrative penalty
17	under Section 441.0102 against a pharmaceutical drug manufacturer
18	that submits to the department the required report or fee, as
19	applicable, on or before the 45th day after the date the
20	manufacturer receives notice under Subsection (a).
21	Sec. 441.0102. ADMINISTRATIVE PENALTY. (a) The department
22	may assess an administrative penalty against a person who violates
23	this chapter or a rule adopted under this chapter.
24	(b) In determining the amount of the penalty, the department
25	shall consider:
26	(1) the person's previous violations;
27	(2) the seriousness of the violation;

1	(3) the person's demonstrated good faith; and
2	(4) any other matters as justice may require.
3	(c) The penalty may not exceed \$1,000 a day for each
4	violation.
5	(d) Each day a violation continues may be considered a
6	separate violation.
7	(e) The enforcement of the penalty may be stayed during the
8	time the order is under judicial review if the person pays the
9	penalty to the clerk of the court or files a supersedeas bond with
10	the court in the amount of the penalty. A person who cannot afford
11	to pay the penalty or file the bond may stay the enforcement by
12	filing an affidavit in the manner required by the Texas Rules of
13	Civil Procedure for a party who cannot afford to file security for
14	costs, subject to the right of the board to contest the affidavit as
15	provided by those rules.
16	(f) The attorney general may sue to collect the penalty.
17	Money collected under this section shall be deposited in the state
18	treasury and may be appropriated only to the department for the
19	purposes of administrating this chapter.
20	Sec. 441.0103. ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDURE. A proceeding to
21	impose an administrative penalty under Section 441.0102 is
22	considered to be a contested case under Chapter 2001, Government
23	<u>Code.</u>
24	SECTION 6. Sections 1369.502(a) and (c), Insurance Code,
25	are amended to read as follows:
26	(a) Not later than <u>March</u> [February] 1 of each year, each
27	pharmacy benefit manager shall file a report with the commissioner.

1 The report must state for the immediately preceding calendar year: 2 the aggregated rebates, fees, price protection (1)3 payments, and any other payments collected from pharmaceutical drug manufacturers; and 4 (2) the aggregated dollar amount of rebates, fees, 5 price protection payments, and any other payments collected from 6 pharmaceutical drug manufacturers that were: 7 8 (A) passed to: 9 (i) health benefit plan issuers; or 10 (ii) enrollees at the point of sale of a prescription drug; or 11 12 (B) retained as revenue by the pharmacy benefit 13 manager. 14 (C) Not later than June [May] 1 of each year, the 15 commissioner shall publish the aggregated data from all reports for that year required by this section in an appropriate location on the 16 17 department's Internet website. The combined aggregated data from the reports must be published in a manner that does not disclose or 18 19 tend to disclose proprietary or confidential information of any pharmacy benefit manager. 20 SECTION 7. Sections 1369.503(a) and (c), Insurance Code, 21 are amended to read as follows: 2.2 Not later than March [February] 1 of each year, each 23 (a) 24 health benefit plan issuer shall submit to the commissioner a report that states for the immediately preceding calendar year: 25 26 (1) the names of the 25 most frequently prescribed 27 prescription drugs across all plans;

(2) the percent increase in annual net spending for
 prescription drugs across all plans;

3 (3) the percent increase in premiums that were4 attributable to prescription drugs across all plans;

5 (4) the percentage of specialty drugs with utilization6 management requirements across all plans; and

7 (5) the premium reductions that were attributable to8 specialty drug utilization management.

9 (C) Not later than June [May] 1 of each year, the 10 commissioner shall publish the aggregated data from all reports for 11 that year required by this section in an appropriate location on the 12 department's Internet website. The combined aggregated data from the reports must be published in a manner that does not disclose or 13 14 tend to disclose proprietary or confidential information of any 15 health benefit plan issuer.

SECTION 8. Subchapter K, Chapter 1369, Insurance Code, is amended by adding Section 1369.5035 to read as follows:

Sec. 1369.5035. CONTENT OF REPORTS. The reports required by Sections 1369.502 and 1369.503 must include information relating to private health benefit plans that cover prescription drugs and are regulated by the department. The reports may not include information relating to:

(1) the child health plan program under Chapter 62,
 Health and Safety Code, or the health benefits plan for children
 under Chapter 63, Health and Safety Code; or

26 (2) the medical assistance program under Chapter 32,
27 Human Resources Code.

1 SECTION 9. (a) Subchapter C, Chapter 441, Health and Safety 2 Code, as added by this Act, applies only to a violation occurring on 3 or after the effective date of this Act.

4 (b) Section 1369.5035, Insurance Code, as added by this Act,
5 applies only to a report submitted on or after the effective date of
6 this Act.

7 SECTION 10. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
