## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

l	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the repeal of the criminal offense of homosexual
- 3 conduct.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Section 21.06, Penal Code, is repealed.
- 6 SECTION 2. Section 85.007(b), Health and Safety Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) The materials in the education programs intended for
- 9 persons younger than 18 years of age must[+
- 10  $\left[\frac{1}{2}\right]$  emphasize sexual abstinence before marriage and
- 11 fidelity in marriage as the expected standard in terms of public
- 12 health and the most effective ways to prevent HIV infection,
- 13 sexually transmitted diseases, and unwanted pregnancies[; and
- 14 [(2) state that homosexual conduct is not an
- 15 acceptable lifestyle and is a criminal offense under Section 21.06,
- 16 Penal Code].
- 17 SECTION 3. Section 163.002, Health and Safety Code, is
- 18 amended to read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 163.002. INSTRUCTIONAL ELEMENTS. Course materials and
- 20 instruction relating to sexual education or sexually transmitted
- 21 diseases should include:
- 22 (1) an emphasis on sexual abstinence as the only
- 23 completely reliable method of avoiding unwanted teenage pregnancy
- 24 and sexually transmitted diseases;

- 1 (2) an emphasis on the importance of self-control,
- 2 responsibility, and ethical conduct in making decisions relating to
- 3 sexual behavior;
- 4 (3) statistics, based on the latest medical
- 5 information, that indicate the efficacy of the various forms of
- 6 contraception;
- 7 (4) information concerning the laws relating to the
- 8 financial responsibilities associated with pregnancy, childbirth,
- 9 and child rearing;
- 10 (5) information concerning the laws prohibiting
- 11 sexual abuse and the legal and counseling options available to
- 12 victims of sexual abuse;
- 13 (6) information on how to cope with and rebuff
- 14 unwanted physical and verbal sexual advances, as well as the
- 15 importance of avoiding the sexual exploitation of other persons;
- 16 <u>and</u>
- 17 (7) psychologically sound methods of resisting
- 18 unwanted peer pressure[ + and
- 19 [(8) emphasis, provided in a factual manner and from a
- 20 public health perspective, that homosexuality is not a lifestyle
- 21 acceptable to the general public and that homosexual conduct is a
- 22 criminal offense under Section 21.06, Penal Code].
- 23 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 24 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 25 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 26 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 27 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
