- 25 (14) the Texas Afghanistan Campaign Medal, which shall
- 26 be awarded to a service member who was inducted into federal service
- 27 from the Texas National Guard after October 6, 2001, in support of

- 1 Operation Enduring Freedom, without regard to the place that the
- 2 service member was deployed while serving on active federal
- 3 military duty; [and]
- 4 (15) the Cold War Medal, which, subject to Subsection
- 5 (c), shall be awarded to a member of the military forces of this
- 6 state or the United States who:
- 7 (A) served between September 2, 1945, and
- 8 December 26, 1991; and
- 9 (B) was a resident of this state at the time the
- 10 service member entered military service; and
- 11 (16) the Texas Border Security and Support Service
- 12 Ribbon, which shall be awarded to a service member of the military
- 13 forces of this state, another state, or the United States who
- 14 served:
- 15 <u>(A) on or after July 28, 2014;</u>
- 16 (B) on state active duty or active duty under
- 17 state authority in accordance with Title 32, United States Code,
- 18 for at least 90 consecutive days, or in response to an emergency
- 19 activation; and
- (C) honorably in support of operations under
- 21 civilian authority to secure this state's international border.
- 22 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
