A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to state agency and local government compliance with
- 3 cybersecurity training requirements.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 772, Government Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 772.012 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 772.012. COMPLIANCE WITH CYBERSECURITY TRAINING
- 8 REQUIREMENTS. (a) In this section, "local government" has the
- 9 meaning assigned by Section 2054.003.
- 10 (b) To apply for a grant under this chapter, a local
- 11 government must submit with the grant application a written
- 12 <u>certification of the local government's compliance with the</u>
- 13 cybersecurity training required by Section 2054.5191.
- 14 (c) On a determination by the criminal justice division
- 15 established under Section 772.006 that a local government awarded a
- 16 grant under this chapter has not complied with the cybersecurity
- 17 training required by Section 2054.5191, the local government shall
- 18 pay to this state an amount equal to the amount of the grant award.
- 19 A local government that is the subject of a determination described
- 20 by this subsection is ineligible for another grant under this
- 21 chapter until the second anniversary of the date the local
- 22 government is determined ineligible.
- SECTION 2. The heading to Section 2054.5191, Government
- 24 Code, is amended to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 2054.5191. CYBERSECURITY TRAINING REQUIRED: CERTAIN
- 2 EMPLOYEES AND OFFICIALS.
- 3 SECTION 3. Sections 2054.5191(a-1) and (b), Government
- 4 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 5 (a-1) At least once each year, a local government shall:
- 6 (1) identify local government employees and elected
- 7 and appointed officials who have access to a local government
- 8 computer system or database and use a computer to perform at least
- 9 25 percent of the employee's or official's required duties; and
- 10 <u>(2)</u> require <u>the</u> [those] employees and [elected]
- 11 officials <u>identified under Subdivision (1)</u> [of the local
- 12 government] to complete a cybersecurity training program certified
- 13 under Section 2054.519 or offered under Section 2054.519(f).
- 14 (b) The governing body of a local government may select the
- 15 most appropriate cybersecurity training program certified under
- 16 Section 2054.519 or offered under Section 2054.519(f) for employees
- 17 and officials of the local government to complete. The governing
- 18 body shall:
- 19 (1) verify and report on the completion of a
- 20 cybersecurity training program by employees and officials of the
- 21 local government to the department; and
- 22 (2) require periodic audits to ensure compliance with
- 23 this section.
- SECTION 4. Section 2056.002(b), Government Code, is amended
- 25 to read as follows:
- 26 (b) The Legislative Budget Board and the governor's office
- 27 shall determine the elements required to be included in each

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- 1 agency's strategic plan. Unless modified by the Legislative Budget
- 2 Board and the governor's office, and except as provided by
- 3 Subsection (c), a plan must include:
- 4 (1) a statement of the mission and goals of the state
- 5 agency;
- 6 (2) a description of the indicators developed under
- 7 this chapter and used to measure the output and outcome of the
- 8 agency;
- 9 (3) identification of the groups of people served by
- 10 the agency, including those having service priorities, or other
- 11 service measures established by law, and estimates of changes in
- 12 those groups expected during the term of the plan;
- 13 (4) an analysis of the use of the agency's resources to
- 14 meet the agency's needs, including future needs, and an estimate of
- 15 additional resources that may be necessary to meet future needs;
- 16 (5) an analysis of expected changes in the services
- 17 provided by the agency because of changes in state or federal law;
- 18 (6) a description of the means and strategies for
- 19 meeting the agency's needs, including future needs, and achieving
- 20 the goals established under Section 2056.006 for each area of state
- 21 government for which the agency provides services;
- 22 (7) a description of the capital improvement needs of
- 23 the agency during the term of the plan and a statement, if
- 24 appropriate, of the priority of those needs;
- 25 (8) identification of each geographic region of this
- 26 state, including the Texas-Louisiana border region and the
- 27 Texas-Mexico border region, served by the agency, and if

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- 1 appropriate the agency's means and strategies for serving each
- 2 region;
- 3 (9) a description of the training of the agency's
- 4 contract managers under Section 656.052;
- 5 (10) an analysis of the agency's expected expenditures
- 6 that relate to federally owned or operated military installations
- 7 or facilities, or communities where a federally owned or operated
- 8 military installation or facility is located;
- 9 (11) an analysis of the strategic use of information
- 10 resources as provided by the instructions prepared under Section
- 11 2054.095; [and]
- 12 (12) a written certification of the agency's
- 13 compliance with the cybersecurity training required under Sections
- 14 2054.5191 and 2054.5192; and
- other information that may be required. (13)
- SECTION 5. (a) Section 772.012, Government Code, as added
- 17 by this Act, applies only to a grant application submitted by a
- 18 local government on or after September 1, 2021.
- 19 (b) Section 2056.002(b), Government Code, as amended by
- 20 this Act, applies only to a strategic plan submitted by a state
- 21 agency on or after January 1, 2022.
- 22 SECTION 6. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 23 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 24 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 25 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 26 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
