## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1	AN ACT

- 2 relating to the establishment of the Texas Uninsured Vehicle
- 3 Enforcement Program.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Chapter 601, Transportation Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subchapter O to read as follows:
- 7 SUBCHAPTER O. TEXAS UNINSURED VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT PROGRAM
- 8 Sec. 601.501. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 9 (1) "Automatic license plate reader system" means a
- 10 system that reads and records license plate numbers taken from
- 11 photographs.
- 12 (2) "Captured plate data" means data collected by an
- 13 automatic license plate reader system.
- 14 (3) "Law enforcement agency" means an agency of the
- 15 state or an agency of a political subdivision of the state
- 16 authorized by law to employ peace officers as defined by Article
- 17 <u>2.12</u>, Code of Criminal Procedure.
- 18 <u>(4) "Program" means the Texas Uninsured Vehicle</u>
- 19 Enforcement Program established under this chapter.
- Sec. 601.502. IMPLEMENTATION OF PROGRAM; RULES. (a) The
- 21 department by rule shall, in consultation with law enforcement
- 22 <u>agencies</u>, establish the Texas Uninsured Vehicle Enforcement
- 23 Program to use automatic license plate reader systems to help law
- 24 enforcement agencies identify uninsured motor vehicles.

- 1 (b) The department may contract with a person to provide
- 2 necessary technology, equipment, and maintenance of automatic
- 3 license plate reader systems used in the program.
- 4 (c) Notwithstanding any other law, the department may:
- 5 (1) install an automatic license plate reader system
- 6 on appropriate infrastructure owned by this state or a political
- 7 <u>subdivision of this state</u>, including traffic signals, highway
- 8 signs, bridges, and overpasses; and
- 9 (2) use infrastructure described by Subdivision (1) as
- 10 necessary to ensure that an automatic license plate reader system
- 11 has access to the necessary power to operate.
- 12 (d) The department may enter into an interagency agreement
- 13 or memorandum of understanding with another state agency to
- 14 authorize the agency to access and use an automatic license plate
- 15 reader system installed under the program for a purpose within the
- 16 agency's statutory duties. An agency's access and use of an
- 17 automatic license plate reader system under this subsection may not
- 18 interfere with the operation of the system by the department or a
- 19 law enforcement agency for the purposes of the program.
- Sec. 601.503. CAPTURED PLATE DATA COLLECTION. (a) The
- 21 department and law enforcement agencies may use automatic license
- 22 plate reader systems to collect captured plate data to enforce the
- 23 financial responsibility requirements of Section 601.191.
- 24 (b) The captured plate data may be accessed only by law
- 25 enforcement agencies and individuals authorized by the department.
- 26 (c) The department may authorize a person under a contract
- 27 described by Section 601.502(b) to perform required updates and

- 1 maintenance of the automatic license plate reader system software
- 2 and to analyze captured plate data as necessary to ensure effective
- 3 system performance.
- 4 Sec. 601.504. AFFIDAVIT. (a) A peace officer may verify by
- 5 sworn affidavit that a photograph generated by an automatic license
- 6 plate reader system identifies a particular vehicle operating on a
- 7 public roadway that was uninsured at the time the vehicle was being
- 8 operated.
- 9 (b) A peace officer may issue a citation to a person for a
- 10 violation of Section 601.191 based on an affidavit under Subsection
- 11 (a) of this section.
- 12 Sec. 601.505. USE OF CAPTURED PLATE DATA. (a) Captured
- 13 plate data collected or retained under the program through the use
- 14 of an automatic license plate reader system must be retained by a
- 15 law enforcement agency if the data is being used as evidence of a
- 16 violation of Section 601.191. If the captured plate data is no
- 17 longer needed as evidence of a violation, the data must be deleted
- 18 or otherwise destroyed.
- 19 (b) Captured plate data collected or retained by the
- 20 department or a law enforcement agency through the use of an
- 21 <u>automatic license plate reader system, as authorized by this</u>
- 22 <u>subchapter</u>, may not be used for a purpose other than enforcing
- 23 <u>Section 601.191.</u>
- (c) The department, a law enforcement agency, and a person
- 25 under contract with the department under Section 601.502(b) may not
- 26 sell or share captured plate data for any purpose not expressly
- 27 authorized by this subchapter.

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- 1 Sec. 601.506. USE OF AUTOMATIC LICENSE PLATE READER SYSTEM.
- 2 This subchapter does not prohibit the use of an automatic license
- 3 plate reader system by a person for a purpose not otherwise
- 4 prohibited by law.
- 5 Sec. 601.507. ANNUAL REPORT. Not later than January 1 of
- 6 each year, the department shall prepare a report on the
- 7 administration and results of the program during the previous
- 8 fiscal year. The report must include an evaluation of program
- 9 operations and any recommendations for legislative or other action.
- 10 The department shall:
- 11 (1) publish the report on the department's Internet
- 12 website; and
- (2) deliver an electronic copy of the report to the
- 14 lieutenant governor and the speaker of the house of
- 15 representatives.
- SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
