5	SECTION 1. Chapter 443, Government Code, is amended by
6	adding Section 443.01527 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 443.01527. REMOVAL OF CERTAIN ITEMS FROM PUBLIC
8	DISPLAY. Not later than December 31, 2021, the board shall remove
9	the following items from public display:
10	(1) the portrait of Albert Sidney Johnson located in
11	the senate chamber;
12	(2) the cannons located on the south grounds of the
13	Capitol and near the south entrance to the Capitol building;
14	(3) the Confederate Soldiers' Monument located on the
15	south grounds of the Capitol;

- 16 (4) the portrait of Richard William "Dick" Dowling
- 17 <u>located in the house chamber;</u>
- 18 (5) Hood's Texas Brigade Monument located on the east
- 19 grounds of the Capitol;
- 20 (6) the portrait of Jefferson Davis located in the
- 21 senate chamber; and
- 22 (7) Terry's Texas Rangers Monument located on the
- 23 south grounds of the Capitol.
- SECTION 2. Section 2165.251(a), Government Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (a) The space in the old State Board of Insurance State
- 3 Office Building, located on San Jacinto Street between 11th and
- 4 12th streets in Austin, the Sam Houston Building, and the
- 5 Jackson-Webber [John H. Reagan] Building are allocated to the
- 6 legislature and legislative agencies for their use.
- 7 SECTION 3. (a) The state office building located on the
- 8 south side of 15th Street between Congress Avenue and Colorado
- 9 Street in Austin, previously known as the John H. Reagan Building,
- 10 is renamed the Jackson-Webber Building in honor of Nathaniel
- 11 Jackson and John Webber.
- 12 (b) As soon as practicable following the effective date of
- 13 this Act, the Texas Facilities Commission shall implement the name
- 14 change made by Subsection (a) of this section.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
