## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

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| 2  | relating to the issuance of a certified birth record, driver's     |

| 5  | BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:            |
| 6  | SECTION 1. Subchapter A, Chapter 191, Health and Safety            |
| 7  | Code, is amended by adding Section 191.00495 to read as follows:   |
| 8  | Sec. 191.00495. BIRTH RECORD ISSUED TO HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL.        |
| 9  | (a) In this section, "homeless individual":                        |
| 10 | (1) means an individual who:                                       |
| 11 | (A) lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate                           |
| 12 | nighttime residence; or  |
| 13 | (B) has a primary nighttime residence that is:                     |
| 14 | (i) a supervised publicly or privately                             |
| 15 | operated shelter designed to provide temporary living              |
| 16 | accommodations, including welfare hotels, congregate shelters, and |
| 17 | transitional housing for persons with mental illness;              |
| 18 | (ii) an institution that provides a                                |
| 19 | temporary residence for individuals intended to be                 |
| 20 | institutionalized; or  |
| 21 | (iii) a public or private place not                                |
| 22 | designed for, or ordinarily used as, a regular sleeping            |
| 23 | accommodation for human beings; and                                |
| 24 | (2) does not include an individual who is imprisoned               |

- 1 or otherwise detained in a correctional facility.
- 2 (b) On request of a homeless individual, the state
- 3 registrar, a local registrar, or a county clerk shall issue,
- 4 without fee, a certified copy of the individual's birth record to
- 5 the individual.
- 6 <u>(c) The department by rule shall:</u>
- 7 (1) adopt a process to verify a person's status as a
- 8 homeless individual; and
- 9 (2) prescribe the documentation necessary for the
- 10 issuance of a certified copy of a birth record to a homeless
- 11 <u>individual whose status is verified through the process</u> adopted
- 12 under Subdivision (1).
- 13 (d) In adopting a verification process under Subsection
- 14 (c), the department shall allow a person requesting a birth record
- 15 to provide a letter certifying the person is a homeless individual
- 16 that is issued by:
- 17 (1) the <u>director of an emergency shelter or</u>
- 18 transitional housing program funded by the United States Department
- 19 of Housing and Urban Development; or
- 20 (2) the director of:
- 21 (A) a shelter for homeless individuals; or
- 22 <u>(B) a transitional living program.</u>
- (e) Notwithstanding any other law of this state, the
- 24 department may not require a homeless individual to provide a
- 25 physical address of the individual's residence to satisfy any
- 26 requirement of this section.
- 27 SECTION 2. Subchapter I, Chapter 521, Transportation Code,

- 1 is amended by adding Section 521.184 to read as follows:
- 2 Sec. 521.184. ISSUANCE OF LICENSE OR CERTIFICATE TO
- 3 HOMELESS INDIVIDUAL. (a) In this section, "homeless individual"
- 4 has the meaning assigned by Section 191.00495, Health and Safety
- 5 Code.
- 6 (b) The department by rule shall:
- 7 (1) adopt a process to verify a person's status as a
- 8 homeless individual;
- 9 (2) prescribe the documentation necessary for the
- 10 issuance of a driver's license or personal identification
- 11 certificate to a homeless individual; and
- 12 (3) exempt a homeless individual from the payment of
- 13 fees under this chapter for the issuance of a driver's license or
- 14 personal identification certificate, subject to Section 521.4265.
- (c) In adopting a verification process under Subsection
- 16 (b), the department shall allow a person applying for a driver's
- 17 license or personal identification certificate to provide a letter
- 18 certifying the person is a homeless individual that is issued by:
- 19 (1) the director of an emergency shelter or
- 20 transitional housing program funded by the United States Department
- 21 of Housing and Urban Development; or
- 22 (2) the director of:
- 23 (A) a shelter for homeless individuals; or
- 24 (B) a transitional living program.
- 25 (d) Notwithstanding any other law of this state and to the
- 26 extent permitted under federal law, the department may not require
- 27 a homeless individual to provide a physical address of the

- 1 individual's residence to satisfy any requirement of this chapter.
- 2 (e) Rules adopted under this section regarding the issuance
- 3 of a personal identification certificate to a homeless child or
- 4 youth, as defined by Section 521.1015, must be consistent with the
- 5 provisions of that section.
- 6 SECTION 3. Sections 521.4265(b) and (c), Transportation
- 7 Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 8 (b) For each exemption granted under Section 521.1015, [ex]
- 9 521.1811, or 521.184, the department shall deposit to the credit of
- 10 the Texas mobility fund an amount from the identification fee
- 11 exemption account under Subsection (a) that is equal to the amount
- 12 of the waived fee that would otherwise be deposited to the mobility
- 13 fund.
- 14 (c) The department may not grant an exemption under Section
- 15 521.1015, [or] 521.1811, or 521.184 if money is not available in the
- 16 identification fee exemption account to meet the requirements of
- 17 Subsection (b).
- SECTION 4. The changes in law made by this Act apply to an
- 19 application for a birth record, driver's license, or personal
- 20 identification certificate submitted on or after the effective date
- 21 of this Act. An application for a birth record, driver's license, or
- 22 personal identification certificate submitted before the effective
- 23 date of this Act is governed by the law in effect on the date the
- 24 application was submitted, and the former law is continued in
- 25 effect for that purpose.
- 26 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
