## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to additional optional training and course work for public
3 school principals.
4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 21, Education Code, is

6 amended by adding Section 21.0461 to read as follows:

Sec. 21.0461. SCHOOL TURNAROUND SPECIALIST ENDORSEMENT TO 7 PRINCIPAL CERTIFICATE. (a) The board shall propose rules 8 9 establishing the training requirements and course work a principal must successfully complete to receive a school turnaround 10 specialist endorsement as an addendum to a principal certificate. 11 In proposing the rules, the board shall ensure that each person who 12 receives the endorsement demonstrates the knowledge and skills 13 necessary to significantly improve teacher and student performance 14 at a campus assigned an overall performance rating of F under 15

16 Section 39.054. (b) The board shall solicit proposals for a school 17 turnaround specialist endorsement program from appropriate 18 educator preparation programs. From among school turnaround 19 specialist endorsement programs proposed to the board that are 20 capable of satisfying the requirements prescribed by Subsection 21 (c), the board may select not more than three of the programs that 22 may be offered to principals. 23

24 (c) A school turnaround specialist endorsement program

2	(1) partner with one or more school districts that
3	need principals with the training and education necessary to
4	significantly improve teacher and student performance at one or
5	more campuses assigned an overall performance rating of F under
6	Section 39.054;
7	(2) have appropriately qualified faculty to:
8	(A) conduct a campus leadership-needs analysis;
9	(B) develop and provide the training and course
10	work required by rules proposed under this section; and
11	(C) provide necessary support to program
12	candidates;
13	(3) establish a selective admissions process to ensure
14	that each principal admitted to the program:
15	(A) possesses a significant knowledge of
16	educational organizations, educational instruction, and teacher
17	<pre>professional development;</pre>
18	(B) demonstrates the ability to develop and
19	implement campus-based systems that result in increased capacity
20	for improving student learning; and
21	(C) demonstrates the attributes of principals
22	who have significantly improved teacher and student performance at
23	underperforming campuses;
24	(4) offer a full-time internship that continues for at
25	least one semester and provides meaningful interaction with the
26	central administrative office of a school district; and
27	(5) collaborate with school districts to provide

- 1 program participants who complete the program continued support for
- 2 at least two years after the participants' initial assignment to a
- 3 campus.
- 4 (d) To be eligible for admission to a school turnaround
- 5 specialist endorsement program under this section, a principal
- 6 must:
- 7 (1) hold a principal certificate;
- 8 (2) have served as a principal or assistant principal
- 9 for at least three school years before applying to the program;
- 10 (3) demonstrate significant knowledge of educational
- 11 organizations, educational instruction, and teacher professional
- 12 development;
- 13 (4) demonstrate the attributes of principals who have
- 14 significantly improved teacher and student performance at
- 15 underperforming campuses; and
- 16 (5) provide evidence of the ability to develop and
- 17 implement campus-based systems that result in increased capacity
- 18 for improving student learning.
- 19 (e) The board shall periodically evaluate school turnaround
- 20 specialist endorsement programs selected under this section. For
- 21 purposes of evaluating the programs, the board shall require each
- 22 program to submit data, as determined appropriate by the board, for
- 23 <u>each year and at each five-year interval.</u>
- SECTION 2. (a) Not later than January 1, 2022, the State
- 25 Board for Educator Certification shall propose rules relating to
- 26 the school turnaround specialist endorsement to the school
- 27 principal certificate as provided by Section 21.0461, Education

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- 1 Code, as added by this Act.
- 2 (b) Not later than March 1, 2022, the State Board for
- 3 Educator Certification shall solicit proposals for a school
- 4 turnaround specialist endorsement program as provided by Section
- 5 21.0461, Education Code, as added by this Act.
- 6 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 7 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 8 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 9 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 10 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
