A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to prescribing low-THC cannabis under the Texas 3 Compassionate Use Program.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

5 SECTION 1. Section 169.002, Occupations Code, is amended to 6 read as follows:

7 Sec. 169.002. PHYSICIAN QUALIFIED TO PRESCRIBE LOW-THC 8 CANNABIS [TO PATIENTS WITH CERTAIN MEDICAL CONDITIONS]. (a) Only a 9 physician qualified [with respect to a patient's particular medical 10 condition] as provided by this section may prescribe low-THC 11 cannabis in accordance with this chapter [to treat the applicable 12 medical condition].

(b) A physician is qualified to prescribe low-THC cannabis
<u>to alleviate the symptoms of</u> [with respect to] a patient's
particular medical condition <u>or the symptoms caused by other</u>
<u>treatments for that medical condition</u> if the physician:

is licensed under this subtitle;

18 (2) is board certified in a medical specialty relevant
19 to the treatment of the patient's particular medical condition by a
20 specialty board approved by the American Board of Medical
21 Specialties or the Bureau of Osteopathic Specialists; and

(3) dedicates a significant portion of clinical practice to the evaluation and treatment of the patient's particular medical condition, and the treatment of symptoms caused

by that medical condition and by other treatments for that medical 1 2 condition. SECTION 2. Section 169.003, Occupations Code, is amended to 3 4 read as follows: Sec. 169.003. PRESCRIPTION OF 5 LOW-THC CANNABIS. Α physician described by Section 169.002 may prescribe low-THC 6 7 cannabis to a patient if: (1) the patient is a permanent resident of the state; 8 9 (2) the physician complies with the registration requirements of Section 169.004; and 10 11 (3) the physician certifies to the department that: the patient is diagnosed with a medical 12 (A) condition that produces symptoms, or the treatment of which 13 produces symptoms, that are alleviated by medical use of low-THC 14 15 cannabis [+ [(i) epilepsy; 16 17 [(ii) a seizure disorder; [(iii) multiple sclerosis; 18 [(iv) spasticity; 19 20 [(v) amyotrophic lateral sclerosis; [(vi) autism; 21 22 [(vii) terminal cancer; or 23 an incurable neurodegenerative [(viii) 24 disease]; and 25 (B) the physician determines the risk of the medical use of low-THC cannabis by the patient is reasonable in 26

light of the potential benefit for the patient.

SECTION 3. Sections 169.001(1-a) and (6), Occupations Code,
 are repealed.
 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
