- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 201.002(a), Occupations Code, is amended
- 5 by adding Subdivision (3-a) to read as follows:
- 6 (3-a) "Neuromusculoskeletal system" means the
- 7 musculoskeletal and nervous systems in relation to disorders that
- 8 manifest in both systems, including disorders of a biomechanical or
- 9 functional nature.
- SECTION 2. Section 201.002(b), Occupations Code, is amended
- 11 to read as follows:
- 12 (b) A person practices chiropractic under this chapter if
- 13 the person:
- 14 (1) uses objective or subjective means to diagnose,
- 15 analyze, examine, or evaluate the biomechanical condition of the
- 16 spine and neuromusculoskeletal [musculoskeletal] system of the
- 17 human body;
- 18 (2) performs nonsurgical, nonincisive procedures,
- 19 including adjustment and manipulation, to improve the subluxation
- 20 complex or the biomechanics of the <u>neuromusculoskeletal</u>
- 21 [musculoskeletal] system;
- 22 (3) represents to the public that the person is a
- 23 chiropractor; or
- 24 (4) uses the term "chiropractor," "chiropractic,"

- 1 "doctor of chiropractic," "D.C.," or any derivative of those terms
- 2 or initials in connection with the person's name.
- 3 SECTION 3. Section 201.003, Occupations Code, is amended by
- 4 adding Subsection (b-1) to read as follows:
- 5 (b-1) This chapter does not permit the unauthorized
- 6 practice of medicine.
- 7 SECTION 4. The amendments made by this Act are a
- 8 clarification of existing law in light of ongoing litigation over
- 9 whether any part of the nervous system is within the scope of
- 10 chiropractic and do not imply that existing law may be construed as
- 11 inconsistent with the law as amended by this Act.
- 12 SECTION 5. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives
- 13 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as
- 14 provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
- 15 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
- 16 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
