A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the services provided by a colonia self-help center.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Sections 2306.586(a), (b), (c), and (d),
- 5 Government Code, are amended to read as follows:
- 6 (a) The purpose of a self-help center is to assist
- 7 individuals and families of low income and very low income to
- 8 finance, refinance, construct, improve, or maintain a safe,
- 9 suitable home and otherwise improve living conditions in the
- 10 colonias' designated service area or in another area the department
- 11 has determined is suitable.
- 12 (b) A self-help center shall set a goal to improve the
- 13 living conditions of residents in the colonias designated under
- 14 Section 2306.583(b) $[\frac{2306.583(a)(2)}{2306.583(a)(2)}]$ within a two-year period
- 15 after a contract is awarded under this subchapter.
- 16 (c) A self-help center may serve individuals and families of
- 17 low income and very low income by:
- 18 (1) providing assistance in obtaining loans or grants
- 19 to build a home;
- 20 (2) teaching construction skills necessary to repair
- 21 or build a home;
- 22 (3) providing model home plans;
- 23 (4) operating a program to rent or provide tools for
- 24 home construction and improvement for the benefit of property

- 1 owners in colonias who are building or repairing a residence or
- 2 installing necessary residential infrastructure;
- 3 (5) helping to obtain, construct, access, or improve
- 4 the service and utility infrastructure designed to service
- 5 residences in a colonia, including potable water, wastewater
- 6 disposal, drainage, streets, and utilities;
- 7 (6) surveying or platting residential property that an
- 8 individual purchased without the benefit of a legal survey, plat,
- 9 or record;
- 10 (7) providing credit and debt counseling related to
- 11 home purchase and finance;
- 12 (8) applying for grants and loans to provide housing
- 13 and other needed community improvements;
- 14 (9) providing other services that the self-help
- 15 center, with the approval of the department, determines are
- 16 necessary to assist colonia residents in improving their [physical]
- 17 living conditions, including help in:
- 18 (A) developing professional skills;
- 19 <u>(B) achieving financial literacy; or</u>
- 20 (C) obtaining suitable alternative housing
- 21 outside of a colonia's area;
- 22 (10) providing assistance in obtaining loans or grants
- 23 to enable an individual or a family to acquire fee simple title to
- 24 property that originally was purchased under a contract for a deed,
- 25 contract for sale, or other executory contract; and
- 26 (11) providing monthly programs to educate
- 27 individuals and families on their rights and responsibilities as

- 1 property owners.
- 2 (d) A self-help center may not provide grants, financing, or
- 3 mortgage loan services to purchase, build, rehabilitate, or finance
- 4 construction or improvements to a home or otherwise improve living
- 5 <u>conditions</u> in a colonia if water service and suitable wastewater
- 6 disposal are not available.
- 7 SECTION 2. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
