4	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
5	SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 501, Government Code, is
6	amended by adding Section 501.0668 to read as follows:
7	Sec. 501.0668. DUTIES FOLLOWING MISCARRIAGE OR PHYSICAL OR
8	SEXUAL ASSAULT OF PREGNANT INMATE. (a) In this section:
9	(1) "Physical assault" means any conduct that
10	constitutes an offense under Section 22.01 or 22.02, Penal Code.
11	(2) "Sexual assault" means any conduct that
12	constitutes an offense under Section 22.011 or 22.021, Penal Code.
13	(b) As soon as practicable after receiving a report of a
14	miscarriage or physical or sexual assault of a pregnant inmate, the
15	department shall ensure that an obstetrician or gynecologist and a
16	mental health professional promptly:
17	(1) review the health care services provided to the
18	inmate; and
19	(2) order additional health care services, including
20	obstetrical and gynecological services and mental health services,
21	as appropriate.
22	SECTION 2. Subchapter C, Chapter 351, Local Government
23	Code, is amended by adding Section 351.048 to read as follows:
24	Sec. 351.048. DUTIES FOLLOWING MISCARRIAGE OR PHYSICAL OR

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1	SEXUAL ASSAULT OF PREGNANT PRISONER. (a) In this section:
2	(1) "Physical assault" means any conduct that
3	constitutes an offense under Section 22.01 or 22.02, Penal Code.
4	(2) "Sexual assault" means any conduct that
5	constitutes an offense under Section 22.011 or 22.021, Penal Code.
6	(b) As soon as practicable after receiving a report of a
7	miscarriage or physical or sexual assault of a pregnant prisoner
8	while in the custody of a county jail, the sheriff shall ensure that
9	an obstetrician or gynecologist and a mental health professional
10	promptly:
11	(1) review the health care services provided to the
12	prisoner; and
13	(2) order additional health care services, including
14	obstetrical and gynecological services and mental health services,
15	as appropriate.
16	SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
