- 6 SECTION 1. Section 107.016, Family Code, is amended to read

- Sec. 107.016. CONTINUED REPRESENTATION; 8 DURATION OF
- 9 APPOINTMENT. In a suit filed by a governmental entity in which
- termination of the parent-child relationship or appointment of the 10
- entity as conservator of the child is requested: 11
- 12 (1)[an order appointing the Department of Family and
- Protective Services as the child's managing conservator may provide 13
- for the continuation of the appointment of the guardian ad litem for 14
- the child for any period during the time the child remains in the 15
- 16 conservatorship of the department, as set by the court;
- 17  $\left[\frac{(2)}{(2)}\right]$  an order appointing the Department of Family and
- Protective Services as the child's managing conservator <a href="may"><u>shall</u></a> [may] 18
- provide for the continuation of the appointment of the guardian ad 19
- <u>litem and the</u> attorney ad litem for the child, or an attorney 20
- appointed to serve in the dual role, as long as the child remains in 21

- 23 (2)  $[\frac{3}{3}]$  an attorney appointed under this subchapter
- to serve as an attorney ad litem for a parent or an alleged father 24

- 1 continues to serve in that capacity until the earliest of:
- 2 (A) the date the suit affecting the parent-child
- 3 relationship is dismissed;
- 4 (B) the date all appeals in relation to any final
- 5 order terminating parental rights are exhausted or waived; or
- 6 (C) the date the attorney is relieved of the
- 7 attorney's duties or replaced by another attorney after a finding
- 8 of good cause is rendered by the court on the record.
- 9 SECTION 2. The changes in law made by this Act apply to a
- 10 suit affecting the parent-child relationship filed before, on, or
- 11 after the effective date of this Act.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
