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## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to a state plan and requirements for nursing facilities to provide care for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related 3 disorders. 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 5 SECTION 1. Effective September 1, 2031, Section 242.032(c), 6 7 Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: (c) The applicant or license holder must furnish evidence to 8 9 affirmatively establish the applicant's or license holder's ability to comply with: 10 11 (1)minimum standards of medical care, nursing care, 12 and financial condition; [and] 13 (2) standards for the specialized care and treatment 14 of persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; and (3) any other applicable state or federal standard. 15 SECTION 2. Effective September 1, 2031, Section 242.037, 16 Health and Safety Code, is amended by amending Subsection (e) and 17 adding Subsection (f-1) to read as follows: 18 (e) In addition to standards or rules required by other 19 provisions of this chapter, the executive commissioner shall adopt 20 and publish and the department shall enforce minimum standards 21 22 relating to: (1) the construction of an institution, including 23 24 heating, lighting, ventilation, and other housing plumbing,

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1 conditions, to ensure the residents' health, safety, comfort, and
2 protection from fire hazard;

3 (2) the regulation of the number and qualification of
4 all personnel, including management and nursing personnel,
5 responsible for any part of the care given to the residents;

6 (3) requirements for in-service education of all7 employees who have any contact with the residents;

8 (4) [training on the care of persons with Alzheimer's 9 disease and related disorders for employees who work with those 10 persons;

11 [(5)] sanitary and related conditions in an 12 institution and its surroundings, including water supply, sewage 13 disposal, food handling, and general hygiene in order to ensure the 14 residents' health, safety, and comfort;

15 (5) [(6)] the nutritional needs of each resident 16 according to good nutritional practice or the recommendations of 17 the physician attending the resident;

18 (6) [(7)] equipment essential to the residents' health 19 and welfare;

20 <u>(7)</u> [<del>(8)</del>] the use and administration of medication in 21 conformity with applicable law and rules;

(8) [(9)] care and treatment of residents and any
 other matter related to resident health, safety, and welfare;

24 (9) [(10)] licensure of institutions; and

25 (10) [(11)] implementation of this chapter.

26 (f-1) The executive commissioner shall adopt, publish, and 27 enforce standards for the specialized care and treatment of persons

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1 with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders, including training requirements for nursing facility employees who provide that 2 specialized care or treatment. The executive commissioner by rule 3 shall adopt and modify as necessary to conform to changes in medical 4 practice a definition of "Alzheimer's disease and related 5 disorders," and may adopt by reference a definition published in a 6 generally accepted clinical resource for medical professionals. 7 The commission may periodically modify the standards as the 8 executive commissioner determines appropriate. 9

10 SECTION 3. The heading to Section 242.040, Health and 11 Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 242.040. CERTIFICATION <u>REQUIREMENTS TO PROVIDE</u> [OF <u>INSTITUTIONS THAT</u>] CARE FOR PERSONS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND RELATED DISORDERS.

15 SECTION 4. Section 242.040, Health and Safety Code, is 16 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), (e), and (f) and 17 adding Subsections (b-1) and (b-2) to read as follows:

(a) The <u>commission</u> [department] shall establish a system
for certifying <u>nursing facilities</u> [institutions] that meet
standards adopted by the executive commissioner concerning the
specialized care and treatment of persons with Alzheimer's disease
and related disorders. <u>The commission may periodically modify the</u>
<u>system and standards as the executive commissioner determines</u>
appropriate.

(b) <u>A nursing facility may not</u> [An institution is not required to be certified under this section in order to] provide care and treatment <u>for</u> [of] persons with Alzheimer's disease and

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related disorders <u>unless the facility holds a certification issued</u>
 <u>under this section</u>.

3 <u>(b-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (b) and subject to</u> 4 <u>Subsection (b-2), a nursing facility is not required to hold a</u> 5 <u>certification issued under this section to provide care and</u> 6 <u>treatment for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related</u> 7 <u>disorders before January 1, 2031.</u>

8 (b-2) A nursing facility that is initially licensed under 9 this chapter on or after January 1, 2023, must hold a certification 10 issued under this section to provide care and treatment for persons 11 with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders.

12 (c) The executive commissioner by rule <u>shall</u> [may] adopt 13 standards for the specialized care and treatment of persons with 14 Alzheimer's disease and related disorders and provide procedures 15 for <u>nursing facilities</u> [institutions] applying for certification 16 under this section. The rules must provide for a three-year 17 certification period.

(e) <u>A nursing facility</u> [<u>An institution</u>] may not advertise or otherwise communicate that the <u>facility</u> [<u>institution</u>] is certified by the <u>commission</u> [<u>department</u>] to provide specialized care for persons with Alzheimer's disease or related disorders unless the facility [<u>institution</u>] is certified under this section.

(f) The executive commissioner by rule shall adopt a system under which an appropriate number of certifications issued by the <u>commission</u> [department] expire on staggered dates occurring in each three-year period. If the expiration date of a certification changes as a result of this subsection, the commission [department]

1 shall prorate the certification fee relating to that certification as appropriate. To the extent possible, the system must align the 2 3 expiration date for a nursing facility's certification under this section with the expiration date for the facility's license under 4 5 this chapter. 6 SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 242, Health and Safety 7 Code, is amended by adding Section 242.0405 to read as follows: 8 Sec. 242.0405. STATE PLAN FOR CERTIFICATION OF NURSING FACILITIES TO PROVIDE CARE FOR PERSONS WITH ALZHEIMER'S DISEASE AND 9 RELATED DISORDERS. (a) The commission shall develop a state plan 10 to certify each nursing facility in this state under Section 11 12 242.040 to provide care and treatment for persons with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders by January 1, 2031, and after that 13 14 date require as part of licensure under this chapter that the 15 facilities comply with the standards formerly required for certification under Section 242.040. The executive commissioner 16 17 must approve the state plan and shall adopt rules for implementing 18 the approved state plan. 19 (b) In developing the state plan, the commission shall: (1) conduct a study on certifying each nursing 20 facility in this state under Section 242.040 by January 1, 2031; and 21 (2) determine and consider in implementing the state 22 plan the: 23 24 (A) costs and challenges; (B) legal and technical issues; and 25 26 (C) scheduling factors and time considerations. (c) The state plan must require that: 27

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1	(1) at least 10 percent of the total number of nursing
2	facilities in this state be certified under Section 242.040 by
3	January 1, 2023;
4	(2) at least 25 percent of the total number of
5	facilities in this state be certified under Section 242.040 by
6	January 1, 2025;
7	(3) at least 50 percent of the total number of
8	facilities in this state be certified under Section 242.040 by
9	January 1, 2027;
10	(4) at least 75 percent of the total number of
11	facilities in this state be certified under Section 242.040 by
12	January 1, 2029; and
13	(5) each facility in this state as part of the
14	facility's license qualification meets the standards for
15	certification under Section 242.040 by January 1, 2031.
16	(d) The state plan may provide for reimbursement to nursing
17	facilities that become certified under Section 242.040 in amounts
18	based on the following schedule:
19	(1) for a facility that is certified by January 1,
20	2023, the state plan may provide for 100 percent reimbursement of
21	the certification costs;
22	(2) for a facility that is certified by January 1,
23	2025, the state plan may reimburse the facility in an amount not to
24	exceed 75 percent reimbursement of the certification costs;
25	(3) for a facility that is certified by January 1,
26	2027, the state plan may reimburse the facility in an amount not to

No. 1323 (4) for a facility that is certified by January 1, 1 2029, the state plan may reimburse the facility in an amount not to 2 exceed 25 percent reimbursement of the certification costs. 3 4 (e) The commission may use existing resources and solicit 5 and accept gifts, grants, and donations from any source to implement the state plan. 6 7 (f) This section expires September 1, 2033. SECTION 6. Section 242.202, Health and Safety Code, is 8 amended by amending Subsection (d) and adding Subsection (d-1) to 9 read as follows: 10 (d) The disclosure statement must contain the following 11 12 categories of information: (1) the nursing facility's [institution's] philosophy 13 14 of care; 15 (2) [whether the institution is certified under Section 242.040 for the provision of specialized care and treatment 16 of residents with Alzheimer's disease and related disorders; 17 [(3)] the preadmission, admission, and discharge 18 19 process; 20 (3) [(4)] resident assessment, care planning, and implementation of the care plan; 21 (4) [<del>(5)</del>] staffing 22 patterns, such as resident-to-staff ratios, and staff training; 23 24 (5) [<del>(6)</del>] the physical environment of the facility 25 [institution]; 26 (6) [<del>(7)</del>] resident activities; 27 (7) [(8)] program costs;

No. 1323 1 (8) [(9)] systems for evaluation of the <u>facility's</u> 2 [institution's] programs for residents; 3 (9) [(10)] family involvement in resident care; and 4 (10) [(11)] the toll-free telephone number maintained 5 by the department for acceptance of complaints against the facility [institution]. 6 (d-1) Before January 1, 2031, the disclosure statement must 7 also include a statement on whether the nursing facility is 8 certified under Section 242.040 for the provision of specialized 9 care and treatment of residents with Alzheimer's disease and 10 related disorders. This subsection expires September 1, 2031. 11 SECTION 7. Effective September 1, 2031, the following 12 provisions of the Health and Safety Code are repealed: 13 Section 242.040; 14 (1)15 (2) Section 242.041; and 16 (3) Section 242.201. 17 SECTION 8. Not later than September 1, 2022, the Health and Human Services Commission shall develop, and the executive 18 commissioner of the commission shall approve and adopt, rules for 19 implementing the state plan required by Section 242.0405, Health 20 21 and Safety Code, as added by this Act. 22 SECTION 9. As soon as practicable after the effective date of this Act, the executive commissioner of the Health and Human 23
