A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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- 2 relating to requiring state contractors and political subdivisions
- 3 of this state to participate in the federal electronic verification
- 4 of employment authorization program, or E-verify.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 2264, Government Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 2264. CERTAIN RESTRICTIONS ON [USE OF CERTAIN] PUBLIC
- 9 SUBSIDIES AND STATE CONTRACTS
- 10 SECTION 2. Section 2264.101, Government Code, is
- 11 transferred to Subchapter B, Chapter 2264, Government Code,
- 12 redesignated as Section 2264.054, Government Code, and amended to
- 13 read as follows:

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- 14 Sec. 2264.054 [2264.101]. RECOVERY. (a) A public agency,
- 15 local taxing jurisdiction, or economic development corporation, or
- 16 the attorney general on behalf of the state or a state agency, may
- 17 bring a civil action to recover any amounts owed to the public
- 18 agency, state or local taxing jurisdiction, or economic development
- 19 corporation under this subchapter [chapter].
- 20 (b) The public agency, local taxing jurisdiction, economic
- 21 development corporation, or attorney general, as applicable, shall
- 22 recover court costs and reasonable attorney's fees incurred in an
- 23 action brought under Subsection (a).
- 24 (c) A business is not liable for a violation of this

- 1 <u>subchapter</u> [chapter] by a subsidiary, affiliate, or franchisee of
- 2 the business, or by a person with whom the business contracts.
- 3 SECTION 3. The heading to Subchapter C, Chapter 2264,
- 4 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:
- 5 SUBCHAPTER C. E-VERIFY PROGRAM [ENFORCEMENT]
- 6 SECTION 4. Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, is
- 7 amended by adding Sections 2264.1011, 2264.102, and 2264.103 to
- 8 read as follows:
- 9 Sec. 2264.1011. DEFINITIONS. In this subchapter:
- 10 (1) "E-verify program" has the meaning assigned by
- 11 Section 673.001.
- 12 (2) "State agency" has the meaning assigned by Section
- 13 2103.001.
- 14 Sec. 2264.102. VERIFICATION BY CONTRACTORS. (a) A state
- 15 agency may not award a contract for goods or services within this
- 16 state to a contractor unless the contractor and any subcontractor
- 17 register with and participate in the E-verify program to verify
- 18 employee information. The contractor and any subcontractor must
- 19 continue to participate in the program during the term of the
- 20 contract.
- 21 (b) Each contract with a state agency must include the
- 22 following statement:
- 23 <u>"______ (name of contractor) certifies that</u>
- 24 _____ (name of contractor) is not ineligible to receive this
- 25 contract under Subchapter C, Chapter 2264, Government Code, and
- 26 acknowledges that if this certification is inaccurate or becomes
- 27 inaccurate during the term of the contract, the contractor may be

- 1 barred from participating in state contracts."
- 2 (c) If a state agency determines that a contractor was
- 3 ineligible to have the contract awarded under Subsection (a), that
- 4 a contractor has ceased participation in the E-verify program
- 5 during the term of the contract, or that a subcontractor is not
- 6 registered with or is not participating in the E-verify program,
- 7 the state agency shall refer the matter to the comptroller for
- 8 action.
- 9 (d) Each state agency shall develop procedures for the
- 10 administration of this section.
- 11 Sec. 2264.103. BARRING FROM STATE CONTRACTS. (a) Using
- 12 procedures prescribed under Section 2155.077, the comptroller
- 13 shall bar a contractor from participating in state contracts if the
- 14 comptroller determines that the contractor:
- 15 (1) was awarded a contract in violation of Section
- 16 2264.102;
- 17 (2) has ceased participation in the E-verify program
- 18 during the term of the contract; or
- 19 (3) hired a subcontractor to perform work under the
- 20 contract who is not registered with or is not participating in the
- 21 E-verify program.
- (b) Debarment under this section is for a period of one year
- 23 except that the debarment may be extended by the comptroller for
- 24 additional one-year periods if the comptroller determines that the
- 25 grounds for debarment under this section continue to exist.
- SECTION 5. Subtitle C, Title 5, Local Government Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Chapter 179 to read as follows:

- 1 CHAPTER 179. VERIFICATION OF EMPLOYEE INFORMATION
- 2 Sec. 179.001. <u>DEFINITIONS</u>. In this chapter:
- 3 (1) "E-verify program" has the meaning assigned by
- 4 Section 673.001, Government Code.
- 5 (2) "Political subdivision" means a county,
- 6 municipality, school district, junior college district, other
- 7 special district, or other subdivision of state government.
- 8 Sec. 179.002. VERIFICATION. A political subdivision shall
- 9 register and participate in the E-verify program to verify
- 10 information of all new employees.
- 11 Sec. 179.003. TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT. An employee of a
- 12 political subdivision who is responsible for verifying information
- 13 of new employees of the political subdivision as required by
- 14 Section 179.002 is subject to immediate termination of employment
- if the employee fails to comply with that section.
- 16 SECTION 6. Each state agency subject to Subchapter C,
- 17 Chapter 2264, Government Code, as amended by this Act, shall
- 18 develop the procedures required under Section 2264.102(d),
- 19 Government Code, as added by this Act, not later than October 1,
- 20 2021.
- 21 SECTION 7. Sections 2264.1011, 2264.102, and 2264.103,
- 22 Government Code, as added by this Act, apply only in relation to a
- 23 contract for which the request for bids or proposals or other
- 24 applicable expression of interest is made public on or after the
- 25 effective date of this Act.
- 26 SECTION 8. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
