6	amended by amending Subsection $(a-2)$ and adding Subsections $(a-3)$
7	and (a-4) to read as follows:
8	(a-2) The department shall waive the park entrance fee for a
9	resident of this state who is a first responder. In this
10	subsection, "first responder" means a person who is:
11	(1) a firefighter certified by the Texas Commission on
12	Fire Protection or by the State Firefighters' and Fire Marshals'
13	Association of Texas;
14	(2) an individual certified as emergency medical
15	services personnel by the Department of State Health Services;
16	(3) a municipal police officer;
17	(4) a sheriff, deputy sheriff, or reserve deputy
18	sheriff; or
19	(5) a constable, deputy constable, or reserve deputy
20	constable.
21	(a-3) The department shall waive the park entrance fee for
22	an active duty member or veteran of the armed services of the United
23	States, the Texas Army National Guard, the Texas Air National

1 <u>(a-4)</u> The department may promote visits and enhance revenue 2 at parks, including amounts necessary for salaries, advertising, 3 consumable supplies and materials, promotional products, fees, and 4 related expenses.

5 SECTION 2. Section 13.018(a), Parks and Wildlife Code, is 6 amended to read as follows:

7 (a) The following people may apply to the department for a8 state parklands passport:

9 (1) a resident of this state who is 65 years old or 10 over who has resided in the state for six consecutive months 11 preceding the date of application for a parklands passport[, a 12 member of the United States armed forces on active duty who is 65 13 years old or over,] or any other individual in a category that the 14 commission by rule designates as a resident of this state who is 65 15 years old or over; and

16 [a veteran of the armed services of the United (2) 17 a result of military service, hag States who. service-connected disability, as defined by the Veterans' 18 Administration, consisting of the loss of the use of a lower 19 extremity or of a 60 percent disability rating and who is receiving 20 compensation from the United States because of the disability; and 21

[(3)] an individual who has a physical or mental impairment that substantially limits one or more of the major life activities of the individual.
