## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to birth records of adopted persons; authorizing a fee.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 4 SECTION 1. Section 192.008, Health and Safety Code, is
- 5 amended by amending Subsections (c) and (d) and adding Subsections
- 6 (g) and (h) to read as follows:
- 7 (c) The executive commissioner shall adopt rules and
- 8 procedures consistent with this section to ensure that birth
- 9 records and indexes under the control of the department or local
- 10 registrars and accessible to the general public do not contain
- 11 information or cross-references through which the confidentiality
- 12 of adoption placements may be directly or indirectly violated. The
- 13 rules and procedures may not interfere with the registries
- 14 established under Subchapter E, Chapter 162, Family Code, or with a
- 15 court order under this section.
- (d) Except as provided by Subsections (e), [and] (f), and
- 17 (g), only the court that granted the adoption may order access to an
- 18 original birth certificate and the filed documents on which a
- 19 supplementary certificate is based.
- 20 <u>(g) The state registrar shall on written request provide to</u>
- 21 a person who was adopted or, if the adopted person is deceased, an
- 22 adult descendant, adult sibling, surviving spouse, or adoptive
- 23 parent of the adopted person, a noncertified copy of the person's
- 24 original birth certificate without obtaining a court order if:

- 1 (1) the adopted person was born in this state;
- 2 (2) the request is made on or after the adopted
- 3 person's 18th birthday;
- 4 (3) a supplementary birth certificate was issued for
- 5 the adopted person; and
- 6 (4) the person requesting the noncertified copy of
- 7 the original birth certificate provides, in person or by mail,
- 8 appropriate proof of the person's identity.
- 9 (h) For a noncertified copy of the person's original birth
- 10 certificate provided under Subsection (g), the state registrar
- 11 shall collect a fee in an amount equal to the fee charged for
- 12 issuance of a noncertified copy of a birth certificate and issue the
- 13 copy within the time prescribed for issuance of other noncertified
- 14 copies of birth certificates.
- SECTION 2. Notwithstanding Sections 192.008(g) and (h),
- 16 Health and Safety Code, as added by this Act, the state registrar is
- 17 not required to comply with those provisions until July 1, 2022.
- SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
