1 AN ACT 2 relating to the duties of a law enforcement agency regarding missing children and missing persons and to the duties of a justice 3 of the peace or other investigator regarding unidentified bodies. 4 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as John and Joseph's Law. SECTION 2. Article 49.04, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 7 amended by adding Subsection (e) to read as follows: 8 9 (e) A justice of the peace investigating a death described by Subsection (a)(3)(B), or the justice's designee, shall, not 10 11 later than the 10th working day after the date that one or more 12 identifying features of the unidentified body are determined or the 60th day after the date the investigation began, whichever is 13 14 earlier, enter all available identifying features of the unidentified body (fingerprints, dental records, any unusual 15 16 physical characteristics, and a description of the clothing found on the body) into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons 17 System. 18 SECTION 3. Section 7, Article 49.25, Code of Criminal 19 20 Procedure, is amended by adding Subsection (d) to read as follows: 21 (d) A person investigating a death described by Section 6(a)(3)(B), or the person's designee, shall, not later than the 22 23 10th working day after the date that one or more identifying features of the unidentified body are determined or the 60th day 24

1 <u>after the date the investigation began, whichever is earlier, enter</u> 2 <u>all available identifying features of the unidentified body</u> 3 <u>(fingerprints, dental records, any unusual physical</u> 4 <u>characteristics, and a description of the clothing found on the</u> 5 <u>body) into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System.</u>

6 SECTION 4. Articles 63.009(a), (b), and (f), Code of 7 Criminal Procedure, are amended to read as follows:

8 (a) <u>A</u> [Local] law enforcement <u>agency</u> [agencies], on
9 receiving a report of a missing child or [a] missing person, shall:

10 (1) if the subject of the report is a child and the 11 child is at a high risk of harm or is otherwise in danger or if the 12 subject of the report is a person who is known by the agency to have 13 or is reported to have chronic dementia, including Alzheimer's 14 dementia, whether caused by illness, brain defect, or brain injury, 15 immediately start an investigation in order to determine the 16 present location of the child or person;

17 (2) if the subject of the report is a child or person 18 other than a child or person described by Subdivision (1), start an 19 investigation with due diligence in order to determine the present 20 location of the child or person;

immediately, but not later than two hours after 21 (3) receiving the report, enter the name of the child or person into the 22 23 clearinghouse $\underline{and}[_{\tau}]$ the national crime information center missing 24 person file if the child or person meets the center's criteria, and report that name to the Alzheimer's Association Safe Return 25 26 emergency response center [crisis number,] if applicable, with all available identifying features such dental 27 as records,

1 fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of 2 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information 3 describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained 4 the missing child or missing person; [and]

5 not later than the 60th day after the date the (4)agency receives the report, enter the name of the child or person 6 into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System, with all 7 8 available identifying features such as dental records, fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of 9 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information 10 describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained 11 12 the missing child or missing person; and

13 (5) inform the person who filed the report of the 14 missing child or missing person that the information will be:

(A) entered into the clearinghouse, the national crime information center missing person file, <u>and the National</u> <u>Missing and Unidentified Persons System;</u> and

18 (B) reported to the Alzheimer's Association Safe
 19 Return emergency response center [crisis number,] if applicable.

(b) Information not immediately available <u>when the original</u> entry is made shall be [obtained by the agency and] entered into the clearinghouse, [and] the national crime information center file, and the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System as a supplement to the original entry as soon as possible.

(f) Immediately after the return of a missing child or missing person or the identification of an unidentified body, the local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction of the

1 investigation shall:

2 <u>(1) clear</u> [cancel] the entry in the national crime 3 information center database; and

4 (2) notify the National Missing and Unidentified
5 Persons System.

6 SECTION 5. (a) Articles 49.04 and 49.25, Code of Criminal 7 Procedure, as amended by this Act, apply only to the investigation 8 of a death of an unidentified person that commences on or after the 9 effective date of this Act. An investigation that commences before 10 the effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when 11 the investigation commenced, and the former law is continued in 12 effect for that purpose.

(b) Article 63.009, Code of Criminal Procedure, as amended 13 14 by this Act, applies only to the report of a missing child or 15 missing person that is made to a law enforcement agency on or after 16 the effective date of this Act. The report of a missing child or missing person that is made to a law enforcement agency before the 17 effective date of this Act is governed by the law in effect when the 18 report was made, and the former law is continued in effect for that 19 purpose. 20

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SECTION 6. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
