A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

1 AN ACT

- 2 relating to the duties of a law enforcement agency regarding
- 3 missing children and missing persons and regarding unidentified
- 4 bodies.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. This Act shall be known as John and Joseph's Law.
- 7 SECTION 2. Article 63.009, Code of Criminal Procedure, is
- 8 amended by amending Subsections (a), (b), (c), and (f) and adding
- 9 Subsections (c-1) and (c-2) to read as follows:
- 10 (a) A [Local] law enforcement agency [agencies], on
- 11 receiving a report of a missing child or [a] missing person, shall:
- 12 (1) if the subject of the report is a child and the
- 13 child is at a high risk of harm or is otherwise in danger or if the
- 14 subject of the report is a person who is known by the agency to have
- 15 or is reported to have chronic dementia, including Alzheimer's
- 16 dementia, whether caused by illness, brain defect, or brain injury,
- 17 immediately start an investigation in order to determine the
- 18 present location of the child or person;
- 19 (2) if the subject of the report is a child or person
- 20 other than a child or person described by Subdivision (1), start an
- 21 investigation with due diligence in order to determine the present
- 22 location of the child or person;
- 23 (3) immediately, but not later than two hours after
- 24 receiving the report, enter the name of the child or person into or

- 1 to the clearinghouse, the national crime information center missing
- 2 person file if the child or person meets the center's criteria, and
- 3 report the information to the Alzheimer's Association Safe Return
- 4 emergency response center [crisis number], if applicable, with all
- 5 available identifying features such as dental records,
- 6 fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of
- 7 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information
- 8 describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained
- 9 the missing child or missing person; [and]
- 10 (4) not later than the 30th day after the date the
- 11 agency receives the report, enter the name of the child or person
- 12 <u>into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System, with all</u>
- 13 available identifying features such as dental records,
- 14 fingerprints, other physical characteristics, and a description of
- 15 the clothing worn when last seen, and all available information
- 16 <u>describing any person reasonably believed to have taken or retained</u>
- 17 the missing child or missing person; and
- 18 (5) inform the person who filed the report of the
- 19 missing child or missing person that the information will be
- 20 entered into or reported to the clearinghouse, the national crime
- 21 information center missing person file, the National Missing and
- 22 <u>Unidentified Persons System,</u> and the Alzheimer's Association Safe
- 23 Return emergency response center [crisis number], if applicable.
- 24 (b) Information not immediately available when the original
- 25 entry is made shall be [obtained by the agency and] entered into the
- 26 clearinghouse, [and] the national crime information center file,
- 27 and the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System as a

- 1 supplement to the original entry as soon as possible.
- 2 (c) All Texas law enforcement agencies or their designees
- 3 are required to enter information about all unidentified bodies
- 4 into the clearinghouse, [and] the national crime information center
- 5 unidentified person file, and the National Missing and Unidentified
- 6 Persons System as described by Subsections (c-1) and (c-2).
- 7 (c-1) A law enforcement agency shall, not later than the
- 8 10th working day after the date the death is reported to the agency,
- 9 enter all available identifying features of the unidentified body
- 10 (fingerprints, dental records, any unusual physical
- 11 characteristics, and a description of the clothing found on the
- 12 body) into the clearinghouse and the national crime information
- 13 center file. If an information entry into the national crime
- 14 information center file results in an automatic entry of the
- 15 information into the clearinghouse, the law enforcement agency is
- 16 not required to make a direct entry of that information into the
- 17 clearinghouse.
- 18 (c-2) A law enforcement agency or their designee shall, not
- 19 later than the 10th working day after which identifying features of
- 20 the unidentified body have been determined, but not later than the
- 21 60th day after the date the death is reported to the agency, enter
- 22 all available identifying features of the unidentified body
- 23 (fingerprints, dental records, any unusual physical
- 24 characteristics, and a description of the clothing found on the
- 25 body) into the National Missing and Unidentified Persons System.
- 26 (f) Immediately after the return of a missing child or
- 27 missing person or the identification of an unidentified body, the

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- 1 local law enforcement agency having jurisdiction of the
- 2 investigation shall:
- $\underline{\text{(1)}}$ cancel clear the entry in the national crime
- 4 information center database; and
- 5 (2) notify the National Missing and Unidentified
- 6 <u>Persons System</u>.
- 7 SECTION 3. The change in law made by this Act applies only
- 8 to the report of a missing child or missing person or an
- 9 unidentified body that is made to a law enforcement agency on or
- 10 after the effective date of this Act. The report of a missing child
- 11 or missing person or an unidentified body that is made to a law
- 12 enforcement agency before the effective date of this Act is
- 13 governed by the law in effect when the report was made, and the
- 14 former law is continued in effect for that purpose.
- 15 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
