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H.B. No. 1461

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

2 relating to a study by the Teacher Retirement System of Texas 3 regarding the use of health reimbursement accounts in conjunction 4 with Medicare plans available through the individual marketplace to 5 provide health and pharmacy benefit coverage for certain retired 6 school employees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

SECTION 1. STUDY. (a) The Teacher Retirement System of 8 9 Texas shall conduct a study to evaluate the use of health in conjunction with Medicare 10 reimbursement accounts plans available through the individual marketplace as a means to provide 11 12 health and pharmacy benefit coverage under Chapter 1575, Insurance Code, for Medicare-eligible retired school employees and their 13 14 spouses.

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(b) The evaluation must consider:

16 (1) using claims experience and premium data from the 17 most recent two years, the affordability and availability of 18 Medicare plans available through the individual marketplace to 19 Medicare-eligible retirees and their spouses compared to health 20 benefit plans available to those retirees and their spouses under 21 Chapter 1575, Insurance Code;

(2) provider availability under Medicare plans
available through the individual marketplace; and

24 (3) any other items the Teacher Retirement System of

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Texas determines are relevant to the system's long-term ability to provide health and pharmacy benefits to Medicare-eligible retirees and their spouses considering the demographic, geographic, and socioeconomic characteristics of the Medicare-eligible retirees and spouses participating in the group program under Chapter 1575, Insurance Code.

7 (c) In conducting the study under this section, the Teacher 8 Retirement System of Texas may contract or collaborate with 9 entities having industry-leading expertise and experience in the 10 individual marketplace.

SECTION 2. REPORT. (a) Not later than December 1, 2021, 11 12 the Teacher Retirement System of Texas shall submit to the 13 governor, lieutenant governor, speaker of the house of 14 representatives, and Legislative Budget Board a written report of the study conducted under Section 1 of this Act. The report must 15 include the findings and legislative recommendations of the Teacher 16 17 Retirement System of Texas.

If the report finds that using health reimbursement 18 (b) 19 accounts in conjunction with Medicare plans available through the individual marketplace could achieve cost savings for the state and 20 for Medicare-eligible retirees and their spouses participating in 21 the group program under Chapter 1575, Insurance Code, while 22 23 providing health and pharmacy benefit coverage substantially 24 equivalent to the coverage provided under the group program, the Teacher Retirement System of Texas shall, to the extent possible, 25 26 begin implementing any recommendations from the report that the system may implement without legislative action. 27

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1 SECTION 3. EXPIRATION DATE. This Act expires January 1, 2 2023.

3 SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 4 immediately if it receives a vote of two-thirds of all the members 5 elected to each house, as provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas 6 Constitution. If this Act does not receive the vote necessary for 7 immediate effect, this Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
