4	SECTION 1. Section 84.011, Election Code, is amended by
5	adding Subsection (c) to read as follows:
6	(c) In addition to the requirements imposed by Subsection
7	(a), the officially prescribed application form for an early voting
8	ballot must include a space for the voter to provide a change of
9	residence address within the county, if applicable.
10	SECTION 2. Section 84.032(c), Election Code, is amended to
11	read as follows:
12	(c) An applicant may submit a request after the close of
13	early voting by personal appearance by appearing in person and:

- (1) returning the ballot to be voted by mail to the 14 early voting clerk; or 15
- executing an affidavit that the applicant: 16
- 17 (A) has not received the ballot to be voted by
- mail; [or] 18
- 19 (B) never requested a ballot to be voted by mail;
- 20 or
- 21 (C) received notice of a defect under Section
- 87.0271(b) or 87.0411(b). 22
- 23 SECTION 3. Section 86.001, Election Code, is amended by
- adding Subsection (f) to read as follows: 24

- 1 (f) If the application includes a change of address within
- 2 the county, the early voting clerk shall notify the voter registrar
- 3 of the change and the registrar shall update the voter's
- 4 registration accordingly.
- 5 SECTION 4. Section 86.002, Election Code, is amended by
- 6 adding Subsection (a-1) to read as follows:
- 7 (a-1) Notwithstanding Subsection (a), the clerk is not
- 8 required to provide a form for a statement of residence to a voter
- 9 who indicated a change of address within the county on the voter's
- 10 application for an early voting ballot to be voted by mail.
- 11 SECTION 5. Subchapter B, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 12 amended by adding Section 87.0271 to read as follows:
- 13 Sec. 87.0271. OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT DEFECT: SIGNATURE
- 14 VERIFICATION COMMITTEE. (a) This section applies to an early
- 15 voting ballot voted by mail:
- 16 (1) for which the voter did not sign the carrier
- 17 envelope certificate;
- 18 (2) for which it cannot immediately be determined
- 19 whether the signature on the carrier envelope certificate is that
- 20 of the voter;
- 21 (3) missing any required statement of residence; or
- 22 (4) containing incomplete information with respect to
- 23 <u>a witness.</u>
- 24 (b) Before deciding whether to accept or reject a timely
- 25 <u>delivered ballot under Section 87.027</u>, the signature verification
- 26 committee may:
- 27 (1) return the carrier envelope to the voter by mail,

- 1 if the signature verification committee determines that it would be
- 2 possible to correct the defect and return the carrier envelope
- 3 before the time the polls are required to close on election day; or
- 4 (2) notify the voter of the defect by telephone or
- 5 e-mail and inform the voter that the voter may come to the early
- 6 voting clerk's office in person to:
- 7 (A) correct the defect; or
- 8 (B) request to have the voter's application to
- 9 vote by mail canceled under Section 84.032.
- 10 (c) If the signature verification committee takes an action
- 11 described by Subsection (b), the committee must take either action
- 12 described by that subsection with respect to each ballot in the
- 13 election to which this section applies.
- 14 (d) A poll watcher is entitled to observe an action taken
- 15 under Subsection (b).
- 16 (e) The secretary of state may prescribe any procedures
- 17 necessary to implement this section.
- 18 SECTION 6. Subchapter C, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 87.0411 to read as follows:
- Sec. 87.0411. OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT DEFECT: EARLY VOTING
- 21 BALLOT BOARD. (a) This section applies to an early voting ballot
- 22 voted by mail:
- 23 (1) for which the voter did not sign the carrier
- 24 envelope certificate;
- 25 (2) for which it cannot immediately be determined
- 26 whether the signature on the carrier envelope certificate is that
- 27 of the voter;

- 1 (3) missing any required statement of residence; or
- 2 (4) containing incomplete information with respect to
- 3 a witness.
- 4 (b) Before deciding whether to accept or reject a timely
- 5 delivered ballot under Section 87.041, the early voting ballot
- 6 board may:
- 7 (1) return the carrier envelope to the voter by mail,
- 8 if the early voting ballot board determines that it would be
- 9 possible to correct the defect and return the carrier envelope
- 10 before the time the polls are required to close on election day; or
- 11 (2) notify the voter of the defect by telephone or
- 12 e-mail and inform the voter that the voter may come to the early
- 13 voting clerk's office in person to:
- 14 (A) correct the defect; or
- 15 (B) request to have the voter's application to
- 16 vote by mail canceled under Section 84.032.
- 17 (c) If the early voting ballot board takes an action
- 18 described by Subsection (b), the board must take either action
- 19 described by that subsection with respect to each ballot in the
- 20 election to which this section applies.
- 21 (d) A poll watcher is entitled to observe an action taken
- 22 under Subsection (b).
- (e) The secretary of state may prescribe any procedures
- 24 necessary to implement this section.
- 25 SECTION 7. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
