- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 5 SECTION 1. Subchapter B, Chapter 87, Election Code, is
- 6 amended by adding Section 87.0271 to read as follows:
- 7 Sec. 87.0271. OPPORTUNITY TO CORRECT DEFECT: SIGNATURE
- 8 VERIFICATION COMMITTEE. (a) This section applies to an early
- 9 voting ballot voted by mail:

- 17 (b) Before deciding whether to accept or reject a ballot
- 18 under Section 87.027, the signature verification committee shall

- (c) Subsection (b) does not apply if the signature
- 23 <u>verification committee determines that it would be impossible to</u>

- 9 address of the voter or witness, as appropriate, to provide the

- 11 (e) If possible, of the two members appointed under
- 12 Subsection (d):
- 13 (1) one must be a member of the party that received the
- 14 greatest number of votes in the most recent gubernatorial election;
- 15 <u>and</u>
- 16 (2) one must be a member of the party that received the
- 17 second greatest number of votes in the most recent gubernatorial
- 18 election.
- 19 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
