A BILL TO BE ENTITLED 1 AN ACT 2 relating to ethnic studies instruction in public schools. 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: SECTION 1. Section 28.002(a), Education Code, is amended to 4 5 read as follows: (a) Each school district that offers kindergarten through 6 grade 12 shall offer, as a required curriculum: 7 (1) a foundation curriculum that includes: 8 9 (A) English language arts; mathematics; 10 (B) 11 (C) science; and 12 (D) social studies, consisting of Texas, United States, and world history, government, economics, with emphasis on 13 14 the free enterprise system and its benefits, [and] geography, and ethnic studies, including Mexican American and African American 15 16 studies; and (2) an enrichment curriculum that includes: 17 18 (A) to the extent possible, languages other than English; 19 health, with emphasis on: 20 (B) 21 (i) physical health, including the 22 importance of proper nutrition and exercise; (ii) mental health, including instruction 23 about mental health conditions, substance abuse, skills to manage 24

No. 1504 1 emotions, establishing and maintaining positive relationships, and responsible decision-making; and 2 3 (iii) suicide prevention, including recognizing suicide-related risk factors and warning signs; 4 5 (C) physical education; (D) fine arts; 6 7 (E) career and technology education; 8 (F) technology applications; 9 (G) religious literature, including the Hebrew 10 Scriptures (Old Testament) and New Testament, and its impact on history and literature; and 11 12 (H) personal financial literacy. SECTION 2. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, is amended 13 14 to read as follows: 15 (b-1) The State Board of Education by rule shall require that the curriculum requirements for the foundation high school 16 17 program under Subsection (a) include a requirement that students successfully complete: 18 four credits in English language arts under 19 (1)Section 28.002(a)(1)(A), including one credit in English I, one 20 credit in English II, one credit in English III, and one credit in 21 an advanced English course authorized under Subsection (b-2); 22 (2) three credits in mathematics under Section 23 24 28.002(a)(1)(B), including one credit in Algebra I, one credit in geometry, and one credit in any advanced mathematics course 25 authorized under Subsection (b-2); 26 (3) three 27 credits in science under Section

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1 28.002(a)(1)(C), including one credit in biology, one credit in any 2 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2), and one 3 credit in integrated physics and chemistry or in an additional 4 advanced science course authorized under Subsection (b-2);

5 (4) three credits in social studies under Section 6 28.002(a)(1)(D), including one credit in United States history, at 7 least one-half credit in government and at least one-half credit in 8 economics, and one credit in <u>ethnic studies</u>, <u>including Mexican</u> 9 <u>American studies and African American studies</u>, world geography, or 10 world history;

(5) except as provided under Subsections (b-12), (b-13), and (b-14), two credits in the same language in a language other than English under Section 28.002(a)(2)(A);

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(6) five elective credits;

15 (7) one credit in fine arts under Section 16 28.002(a)(2)(D); and

17 (8) except as provided by Subsection (b-11), one
18 credit in physical education under Section 28.002(a)(2)(C).

19 SECTION 3. Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as amended 20 by this Act, applies only to students entering the ninth grade 21 during the 2022-2023 school year or a later school year. For 22 students entering a grade above ninth grade during the 2022-2023 23 school year, Section 28.025(b-1), Education Code, as that section 24 existed before amendment by this Act, applies, and that section is 25 continued in effect for that purpose.

26 SECTION 4. This Act takes effect immediately if it receives 27 a vote of two-thirds of all the members elected to each house, as

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provided by Section 39, Article III, Texas Constitution. If this
 Act does not receive the vote necessary for immediate effect, this
 Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
