## A BILL TO BE ENTITLED

AN ACT

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2 relating to the transfer of Midwestern State University to the 3 Texas Tech University System, to certain fees charged by that 4 system's governing board, and to mandatory venue for actions 5 brought against that system or its institutions, officers, or 6 employees.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:

8 SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Chapter 109, Education Code, is 9 amended by adding Subchapter E to read as follows:

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SUBCHAPTER E. MIDWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY

Sec. 109.201. ESTABLISHMENT; SCOPE. (a) Midwestern State
University is a general academic teaching institution located in
the city of Wichita Falls.

14 (b) The university is a component institution of the Texas 15 Tech University System and is under the management and control of 16 the board of regents of the Texas Tech University System. The board 17 of regents has the same powers and duties concerning Midwestern 18 State University as are conferred on the board by statute 19 concerning Texas Tech University.

20 <u>Sec. 109.202. COURSES AND DEGREES; ADMINISTRATION. (a) The</u> 21 <u>university shall offer undergraduate-level and graduate-level</u> 22 <u>programs.</u>

(b) The board of regents may approve degree programs,
 subject to the approval of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating

1 Board, and adopt other rules necessary for the operation and 2 management of the university.

3 (c) The university is subject to the authority of the Texas
4 Higher Education Coordinating Board.

Sec. 109.203. UNIVERSITY OF FIRST RANK. The board of 5 regents shall build and operate the university as a public liberal 6 arts university of the first rank to offer the university's 7 8 students, consistent with the university's mission, preparation for excellence in a variety of careers and exploration of a variety 9 of interests. The university shall be equipped as necessary to do 10 its work as well as comparable public institutions of higher 11 12 education in this state.

13 <u>Sec. 109.204. UNIVERSITY MUSEUM. The Texas Higher</u> 14 <u>Education Coordinating Board shall include in the funding formula</u> 15 <u>applicable to the university funding for the operation and</u> 16 <u>maintenance of the museum acquired by the university in accordance</u> 17 <u>with former Section 103.11.</u>

18 Sec. 109.205. GIFTS AND GRANTS. The board of regents may 19 solicit, accept, and administer gifts and grants for the use and 20 benefit of the university.

21 SECTION 2. TRANSFER OF GOVERNANCE OF UNIVERSITY; ABOLITION 22 OF BOARD OF REGENTS. The governance, control, management, and 23 property of Midwestern State University are transferred from the 24 board of regents of Midwestern State University to the board of 25 regents of the Texas Tech University System. The transfer is 26 governed by Sections 3 through 8 of this Act. Following the 27 transfer, the board of regents of Midwestern State University is

1 abolished.

2 SECTION 3. POWERS AND DUTIES; RULES AND POLICIES. (a) When 3 the transfer takes effect, the board of regents of the Texas Tech 4 University System shall govern, operate, manage, and control 5 Midwestern State University and all land, buildings, facilities, 6 improvements, equipment, supplies, and property belonging to and 7 constituting Midwestern State University under the powers and 8 duties conferred by law on the board of regents.

9 (b) Midwestern State University may continue to award 10 degrees in the same disciplines and of the same academic standing 11 after the transfer authorized by this Act as those in which degrees 12 were awarded by the university before this Act, subject to the 13 authority of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board 14 regarding existing degree programs.

Rules and policies adopted by the board of regents of 15 (c) Midwestern State University to govern the university that are in 16 17 effect when the transfer takes effect are continued in effect until adopted, repealed, or superseded by the board of regents of the 18 19 Texas Tech University System. The board of regents of the Texas Tech University System may adopt rules and policies applicable to 20 the university in anticipation of the transfer authorized by this 21 22 Act.

23 SECTION 4. CONTRACTS AND WRITTEN OBLIGATIONS, INCLUDING 24 BONDS. Contracts and written obligations of every kind and 25 character entered into by the board of regents of Midwestern State 26 University or the Texas Public Finance Authority for and on behalf 27 of Midwestern State University, including bonds, are considered

1 ratified, confirmed, and validated by the board of regents of the 2 Texas Tech University System on the effective date of the transfer. 3 In those contracts and written obligations, the board of regents of 4 the Texas Tech University System is substituted for and stands and 5 acts in the place of the board of regents of Midwestern State 6 University or the Texas Public Finance Authority, as applicable, to 7 the extent permitted by law.

FEES. SECTION 5. TUITION AND 8 The tuition and fees authorized by the board of regents of Midwestern State University 9 10 before the transfer of governance under this Act remain in effect until the board of regents of the Texas Tech University System 11 authorizes a different amount of tuition and fees for the 12 university as provided by law. 13

14 SECTION 6. EFFECT OF TRANSFER ON STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES. 15 (a) The transfer of the governance of Midwestern State University 16 under this Act does not affect the status of any student of the 17 university enrolled at the university when the transfer takes 18 effect.

(b) The transfer of the governance of Midwestern State University under this Act does not affect the employment status or accrued benefits of any person employed by the university when the transfer takes effect.

23 SECTION 7. CURRENT FUNDING. All funds that, on the 24 effective date of the transfer, have been appropriated or dedicated 25 to or are held for the use and benefit of Midwestern State 26 University under the governance of the board of regents of the 27 university are transferred to the board of regents of the Texas Tech

1 University System for the use and benefit of the university. Other 2 funds held for the use and benefit of Midwestern State University 3 shall continue to be available for the use and benefit of the 4 university notwithstanding the change in governance made by this 5 Act.

6 SECTION 8. LEGISLATIVE INTENT; ROLE OF COORDINATING BOARD. 7 It is the intent of the legislature that the transfer of the 8 governance of Midwestern State University from the board of regents of the university to the board of regents of the Texas Tech 9 10 University System be made without disrupting the students, faculty, staff, or programs of the university. If those boards of regents 11 12 are unable to agree as to any matter relating to the transfer, the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board on application of either 13 14 board of regents shall resolve the disagreement consistent with the 15 intent of this section and the provisions of this Act as the coordinating board determines is in the best interest of this state 16 17 and the institutions under the governance of the boards of regents. The coordinating board may issue any orders or take any other action 18 19 the coordinating board considers appropriate to enforce this section or to facilitate the transfer consistent with this Act and 20 the intent of the legislature. 21

22 SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 54.508(a), Education Code, 23 is amended to read as follows:

(a) The board of regents of the Texas Tech University System
may charge each student registered at a component institution of
the Texas Tech University System a medical services fee not to
exceed \$100 for each semester <u>or</u> [of the regular] term [or 12-week

1 summer session and not to exceed \$50 for each six-week or shorter
2 term of the summer session].

3 SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 54.509, Education Code, is 4 amended by amending Subsections (a) and (b) and adding Subsection 5 (e) to read as follows:

6 (a) If approved by student vote, the board of regents of the 7 Texas Tech University System may charge each student enrolled at a 8 component institution of the Texas Tech University System a 9 recreation fee not to exceed <u>\$150</u> [<del>\$100</del>] per semester or <u>\$75</u> [<del>\$50</del>] 10 per six-week summer term to be used to purchase equipment for and to 11 <u>finance, construct, operate, renovate,</u> and maintain the student 12 recreation facilities and programs at the institution.

(b) The fee may not be increased by more than 10 percent from
one academic year to the next unless the increase is approved by:

15 <u>(1)</u> a majority of students voting on the issue in a 16 general student election called for that purpose; or

17 (2) a majority vote of the student government at the 18 institution.

19 (e) The board of regents may pledge the fees imposed under 20 this section to pay obligations issued for authorized purposes 21 pursuant to the revenue financing system of the Texas Tech 22 University System.

23 SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 55.13(c), Education Code, 24 is amended to read as follows:

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision of this section,
 with respect to all bonds authorized to be issued by [Midwestern
 State University or] Texas Southern University, the Texas Public

Finance Authority shall exercise the authority of a board to issue bonds on behalf of <u>that university</u> [those institutions], in the manner provided by this subchapter, including the authority to issue refunding bonds under Section 55.19. In connection with the issuance of bonds under this chapter, the Texas Public Finance Authority has all the rights and duties granted or assigned to and is subject to the same conditions as a board under this chapter.

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8 SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Subchapter B, Chapter 55, Education 9 Code, is amended by adding Section 55.17893 to read as follows:

10 Sec. 55.17893. MIDWESTERN STATE UNIVERSITY. (a) In addition to the other authority granted by this subchapter, the 11 12 board of regents of the Texas Tech University System may issue bonds in accordance with this subchapter and in accordance with a 13 systemwide revenue financing program adopted by the board in the 14 aggregate principal amounts not to exceed the amounts previously 15 authorized for Midwestern State University by Sections 55.1727, 16 17 55.1737, 55.1757, and 55.1787, as those sections existed immediately before this section took effect, less any portion of 18 19 those amounts for which bonds were issued under those sections for the university before the date this section took effect. Subject to 20 Subsection (d), bonds issued under this section for an amount 21 previously authorized by Section 55.1727, 55.1737, 55.1757, or 22 55.1787 may be used only at Midwestern State University for the 23 purposes for which the bonds were authorized to be issued for the 24 university under Section 55.1727, 55.1737, 55.1757, or 55.1787, as 25 26 applicable.

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(b) The board of regents of the Texas Tech University System

1 may pledge irrevocably to the payment of those bonds all or any part 2 of the revenue funds of an institution, branch, or entity of the Texas Tech University System. The amount of a pledge made under 3 this subsection may not be reduced or abrogated while the bonds for 4 5 which the pledge is made, or bonds issued to refund those bonds, are 6 outstanding. 7 (c) If sufficient funds are not available to the board of 8 regents of the Texas Tech University System to meet its obligations under this section, the board may transfer funds among 9 10 institutions, branches, and entities of the Texas Tech University System to ensure the most equitable and efficient allocation of 11 12 available resources for each institution, branch, or entity to 13 carry out its duties and purposes. (d) Any portion of the proceeds of bonds authorized by this 14 section for one or more specified projects that is not required for 15 16 the specified projects may be used to renovate existing structures 17 and facilities at the university. (e) The board of regents of the Texas Tech University System 18 19 may issue refunding bonds under Chapter 1207, Government Code, to refund all or any part of the outstanding bonds, notes, or other 20 general or special obligations issued by or for the benefit of 21 22 Midwestern State University, including obligations previously issued by the Texas Public Finance Authority. For purposes of 23 24 Chapter 1207, Government Code, and in connection with the issuance of any refunding bonds under that chapter, the board of regents of 25 26 the Texas Tech University System shall be considered the issuer of the outstanding bonds, notes, or obligations of Midwestern State 27

## 1 University which are being refunded.

2 SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 62.021(a), Education Code,
3 is amended to read as follows:

4 In each state fiscal year beginning with the state (a) 5 fiscal year ending August 31, 2021, an eligible institution is entitled to receive an amount allocated in accordance with this 6 section from the funds appropriated for that year by Section 17(a), 7 8 Article VII, Texas Constitution. The comptroller shall distribute funds allocated under this subsection only on presentation of a 9 claim and issuance of a warrant in accordance with Section 403.071, 10 11 Government Code. An eligible institution may not present a claim to 12 be paid from any funds allocated under this subsection before the delivery of goods or services described in Section 17, Article VII, 13 14 Texas Constitution, except for the payment of principal or interest 15 on bonds or notes or for a payment for a book or other published library material as authorized by Section 2155.386, Government 16 17 Code. The allocation of funds under this subsection is made in accordance with an equitable formula consisting of the following 18 elements: space deficit, facilities condition, institutional 19 complexity, and a separate allocation for the Texas State Technical 20 College System. The annual amounts allocated by the formula are as 21 22 follows:

(E) \$4,933,200 to Midwestern State University; 1 2 (6) [<del>(7)</del>] \$14,554,133 to Texas Woman's University; (7) [(8)] to the following component institutions of 3 the University of Houston System: 4 5 (A) \$54,514,004 to the University of Houston; 6 (B) \$3,542,817 University to the of 7 Houston--Victoria; 8 (C) \$7,726,043 to the University of 9 Houston--Clear Lake; and 10 (D) \$10,828,344 to the University of Houston--Downtown; 11 (8) [(9)] to the following component institutions of 12 The Texas A&M University System: 13 14 (A) \$11,478,824 to Texas A&M University--Corpus 15 Christi; 16 (B) \$7,462,394 to Texas A&M International 17 University; (C) \$8,858,060 18 to Texas A&M University--Kingsville; 19 20 \$7,446,495 to West Texas A&M University; (D) 21 (E) \$11,123,859 to Texas A&M University--Commerce; and 22 (F) \$2,050,273 23 to Texas A&M 24 University--Texarkana; and 25 (9) [(10)] \$8,662,500 to the Texas State Technical 26 College System Administration and the following component campuses, but not its extension centers or programs: 27

AMENDMENT. Subchapter A, Chapter 109, Education Code, is amended by adding Section 109.005 to read as 9 follows: 10 Sec. 109.005. MANDATORY VENUE. (a) Venue for a suit filed 11 12 against the board or a member of the board in the member's official 13 capacity is in Lubbock County. 14 (b) Venue for a suit filed against the Texas Tech University 15 System, any component of the Texas Tech University System, or any officer or employee of the Texas Tech University System or of any 16 17 component of the Texas Tech University System is in the county in which the primary office of the chief executive officer of the 18 19 system or component, as applicable, is located. (c) This section does not waive any defense to or immunity 20 from suit or liability that may be asserted by an entity or 21 individual described by this section. 22 23 (d) In case of a conflict between this section and any other 24 law, this section controls. SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Section 1232.101(a), Government 25 26 Code, is amended to read as follows:

27 (a) With respect to all bonds authorized to be issued by or

1 on behalf of the Texas Military Department, Parks and Wildlife Department, Texas Agricultural Finance Authority, Texas Low-Level 2 3 Radioactive Waste Disposal Authority, [Midwestern State University, and Texas Southern University, the authority has the 4 5 exclusive authority to act on behalf of those entities in issuing bonds on their behalf. In connection with those issuances and with 6 the issuance of refunding bonds on behalf of those entities, the 7 authority is subject to all rights, duties, and conditions 8 surrounding issuance previously applicable to the issuing entity 9 under the statute authorizing the issuance. A reference in an 10 authorizing statute to the entity on whose behalf the bonds are 11 being issued applies equally to the authority in its capacity as 12 issuer on behalf of the entity. 13

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14 SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 501.022, Labor Code, is 15 amended by amending Subsection (a) and adding Subsection (g) to 16 read as follows:

17 (a) An eligible employee of Texas Tech University, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center, Angelo State University, 18 19 Texas Tech University System Administration, Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center at El Paso, Midwestern State University, or 20 another agency under the direction and control of the board of 21 regents of the Texas Tech University System is entitled to 22 in the workers' compensation program for 23 participate state 24 employees provided under this chapter.

25 (g) For purposes of this chapter, Midwestern State
26 University is a state agency and shall act in the capacity of
27 employer.

1 SECTION 17. TRANSITION. Section 109.005, Education Code, 2 as added by this Act, applies only to an action brought against the 3 board of regents of the Texas Tech University System or a member of 4 that board in the member's official capacity, the Texas Tech 5 University System, a component institution of that system, or an 6 officer or employee of that system or of a component institution of 7 that system on or after the effective date of this Act.

8 SECTION 18. REPEALER. The following provisions of the 9 Education Code are repealed:

10 (1) Section 54.241(h);

11 (2) Sections 54.5082, 54.518, 54.5441, 54.5442, 12 55.1727, 55.1737, 55.1757, and 55.1787; and

13 (3) Chapter 103.

14 SECTION 19. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act takes effect 15 September 1, 2021.
