- 4 (c) The office shall collect and analyze data regarding:
- 5 (1) the rate of recidivism among defendants who
- 6 successfully completed a veterans treatment court program; and
- 7 (2) the statewide rate of recidivism among defendants
- 8 who have committed offenses for which a veteran may be eligible to
- 9 participate in a veterans treatment court program.
- 10 (d) Subsection (c) and this subsection expire September 1,
- 11 2031.
- 12 SECTION 3. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
