- 3 Commission as an advisory committee to the Texas Historical
- 4 Commission.

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- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS:
- 6 SECTION 1. The heading to Chapter 449, Government Code, is
- 7 amended to read as follows:
- 8 CHAPTER 449. TEXAS HOLOCAUST AND GENOCIDE ADVISORY COMMITTEE
- 9 [COMMISSION]
- SECTION 2. Section 449.001, Government Code, is amended by
- 11 amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivision (1-a) to read as
- 12 follows:
- 13 (1) "Advisory committee" means the Texas Holocaust and
- 14 Genocide Advisory Committee.
- 15 (1-a) "Commission" means the Texas Historical
- 16 [Holocaust and Genocide] Commission.
- SECTION 3. Section 449.002, Government Code, is amended to
- 18 read as follows:
- 19 Sec. 449.002. APPLICATION OF SUNSET ACT [PROVISION]. The
- 20 advisory committee [Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission] is
- 21 subject to Chapter 325 (Texas Sunset Act). The advisory committee
- 22 shall be reviewed during the period in which the commission is
- 23 reviewed [Unless continued in existence as provided by that
- 24 chapter, the commission is abolished and this chapter expires

- 1 ELIGIBILITY; APPOINTMENT; VACANCY. (a) A person appointed as a
- 2 [public] member of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] must be a
- 3 resident of this state.
- 4 (b) $\underline{\text{Members}}$ [Public members] of the $\underline{\text{advisory committee}}$
- 5 [commission] must include:
- 6 (1) persons who have served prominently as leaders of
- 7 or spokespersons for public or private organizations that serve
- 8 members of religious, ethnic, national heritage, or social groups
- 9 that were subjected to the Holocaust or other genocides;
- 10 (2) persons who have significant professional
- 11 experience in the field of Holocaust or genocide education;
- 12 (3) persons who represent liberators of Holocaust or
- 13 other genocide victims; and
- 14 (4) persons who have demonstrated a significant,
- 15 particular interest in Holocaust or genocide education.
- 16 (c) Appointments of [public] members to the advisory
- 17 committee [commission] shall be made:
- 18 (1) without regard to the race, color, disability,
- 19 sex, religion, age, or national origin of an appointee; and
- 20 (2) so that each geographic area of this state is
- 21 represented on the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission].
- 22 (d) The original appointing authority shall fill any
- 23 vacancy in <u>a</u> [an appointed] position on the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 24 [commission] for the unexpired portion of the term.
- 25 SECTION 6. Section 449.007, Government Code, is amended to
- 26 read as follows:
- Sec. 449.007. REMOVAL OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE [PUBLIC]

- 1 MEMBER. (a) It is a ground for removal of a [public] member from
- 2 the advisory committee [commission] if the member:
- 3 (1) is ineligible for [public] membership under
- 4 Section 449.005(a);
- 5 (2) cannot because of illness or disability discharge
- 6 the member's duties for a substantial part of the term for which the
- 7 member is appointed; or
- 8 (3) is absent from more than three consecutive
- 9 regularly scheduled advisory committee [commission] meetings that
- 10 the member is eligible to attend during a calendar year unless the
- 11 absence is excused by majority vote of the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 12 [commission].
- 13 (b) The validity of an action of the advisory committee
- 14 [commission] is not affected by the fact that it is taken when a
- 15 ground for removal of <u>an advisory committee</u> [a commission] member
- 16 exists.
- (c) If a member of the advisory committee [commission] has
- 18 knowledge that a potential ground for removal exists, the member
- 19 shall notify the presiding officer of the advisory committee
- 20 [commission] of the potential ground. The presiding officer shall
- 21 then notify the governor and the attorney general that a potential
- 22 ground for removal exists.
- 23 SECTION 7. Section 449.008, Government Code, is amended to
- 24 read as follows:
- Sec. 449.008. TERM OF ADVISORY COMMITTEE [PUBLIC] MEMBER.
- 26 (a) Members [Public members] of the advisory committee
- 27 [commission] serve staggered four-year terms with the terms of

- 1 seven or eight members expiring February 1 of each odd-numbered
- 2 year.
- 3 (b) An advisory committee [A public] member is eligible for
- 4 reappointment to another term or part of a term.
- 5 (c) An advisory committee [A public] member may not serve
- 6 more than two consecutive terms. For purposes of this prohibition,
- 7 a member is considered to have served a term only if the member has
- 8 served more than half of the term.
- 9 SECTION 8. Section 449.009, Government Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 449.009. OFFICERS; SUBCOMMITTEES. (a) The governor
- 12 shall designate a [public] member of the advisory committee
- 13 [commission] as presiding officer to serve in that capacity at the
- 14 pleasure of the governor.
- 15 (b) The presiding officer of the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 16 [commission] may appoint a subcommittee for any purpose consistent
- 17 with the duties of the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] under this
- 18 chapter.
- 19 SECTION 9. Section 449.010, Government Code, is amended to
- 20 read as follows:
- Sec. 449.010. COMPENSATION; EXPENSES. [(a)] A [public]
- 22 member of the advisory committee [commission] is not entitled to
- 23 compensation but is entitled to reimbursement for the travel
- 24 expenses incurred by the member while transacting advisory
- 25 <u>committee</u> [commission] business, as provided by the General
- 26 Appropriations Act.
- 27 [(b) An ex officio member's service on the commission is an

- 1 additional duty of the underlying position that qualifies the
- 2 member for service on the commission. The entitlement of an ex
- 3 officio member to compensation or to reimbursement for travel
- 4 expenses incurred while transacting commission business is
- 5 governed by the law that applies to the member's service in that
- 6 underlying position, and any payment to the member for either
- 7 purpose must be made from money that may be used for the purpose and
- 8 is available to the state agency that the member serves in that
- 9 underlying position.
- 10 SECTION 10. Section 449.011, Government Code, is amended to
- 11 read as follows:
- 12 Sec. 449.011. MEETINGS; QUORUM; VOTING; PUBLIC ACCESS. (a)
- 13 The advisory committee [commission] shall meet at least quarterly
- 14 at the times and places in this state that the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 15 [commission] designates.
- 16 (b) Seven voting members of the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 17 [commission] constitute a quorum for transacting advisory
- 18 committee [commission] business.
- 19 (c) [An ex officio member of the commission may not vote on
- 20 commission business.
- 21 [(d)] The <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] shall develop and
- 22 implement policies that provide the public with a reasonable
- 23 opportunity to appear before the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission]
- 24 and speak on any issue under the jurisdiction of the advisory
- 25 committee [commission].
- SECTION 11. Subchapter A, Chapter 449, Government Code, is
- 27 amended by adding Section 449.0115 to read as follows:

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- 1 Sec. 449.0115. TRAINING. Each member of the advisory
- 2 committee shall complete the training program prescribed by the
- 3 commission. The program must provide the member with information
- 4 on:
- 5 (1) the role and duties of advisory committee members;
- 6 (2) the functions of the advisory committee; and
- 7 (3) the commission's oversight of the advisory
- 8 committee.
- 9 SECTION 12. Section 449.012, Government Code, is amended to
- 10 read as follows:
- 11 Sec. 449.012. PERSONNEL [COORDINATOR]. The commission
- 12 shall:
- 13 (1) hire [Texas Historical Commission shall provide]
- 14 personnel as necessary to support the advisory committee in
- 15 fulfilling its duties under this chapter, including establishing
- 16 staffing levels, position titles, and salaries of the employees and
- 17 managing and evaluating the employees; and
- 18 (2) provide other administrative support to the
- 19 advisory committee as necessary [one part-time employee to serve as
- 20 the coordinator for the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission to
- 21 transact commission business].
- 22 SECTION 13. Subchapter A, Chapter 449, Government Code, is
- 23 amended by adding Section 449.013 to read as follows:
- Sec. 449.013. APPLICABILITY OF OTHER LAW. Chapter 2110
- 25 does not apply to the advisory committee.
- SECTION 14. The heading to Subchapter B, Chapter 449,
- 27 Government Code, is amended to read as follows:

- 1 SUBCHAPTER B. POWERS AND DUTIES OF COMMISSION AND
- 2 ADVISORY COMMITTEE; FUNDING
- 3 SECTION 15. Subchapter B, Chapter 449, Government Code, is
- 4 amended by adding Section 449.0515 to read as follows:
- 5 Sec. 449.0515. MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING. The commission
- 6 and advisory committee shall:
- 7 (1) enter into a memorandum of understanding to
- 8 establish the roles and responsibilities of the commission and
- 9 advisory committee under this chapter, including necessary
- 10 policies and procedures; and
- 11 (2) periodically review and update the memorandum as
- 12 necessary to carry out the purposes of this chapter.
- 13 SECTION 16. Section 449.052, Government Code, is amended to
- 14 read as follows:
- 15 Sec. 449.052. GENERAL POWERS AND DUTIES OF ADVISORY
- 16 COMMITTEE AND COMMISSION. (a) The advisory committee, under
- 17 direction of the commission, shall:
- 18 (1) provide advice and assistance to public and
- 19 private primary and secondary schools and institutions of higher
- 20 education in this state regarding implementation of Holocaust and
- 21 genocide courses of study and awareness programs;
- 22 (2) meet with appropriate representatives of public
- 23 and private organizations, including service organizations, to
- 24 provide information on and to assist in planning, coordinating, or
- 25 modifying Holocaust and genocide courses of study and awareness
- 26 programs;
- 27 (3) [determine which, if any, existing Holocaust or

- 1 other genocide memorials, exhibits, or other resources could be
- 2 included in or used to support Holocaust and genocide courses of
- 3 study and awareness programs;
- 4 $\left[\frac{(4)}{(4)}\right]$ compile a list of volunteers, such as Holocaust
- 5 or other genocide survivors, liberators of concentration camps,
- 6 scholars, and members of the clergy, who have agreed to share, in
- 7 classrooms, seminars, exhibits, or workshops, their verifiable
- 8 knowledge and experiences regarding the Holocaust or other
- 9 genocide;
- 10 (4) (5) coordinate events in this state
- 11 memorializing the Holocaust and other genocides on January 27,
- 12 International Holocaust Remembrance Day, on the Days of Remembrance
- 13 established by the United States Congress, or on any other day
- 14 designated by the advisory committee [commission] for that purpose;
- 15 and
- 16 (5) [(6)] solicit volunteers to participate in
- 17 commemorative events designed to enhance public awareness of the
- 18 continuing significance of the Holocaust and other genocides.
- (b) In implementing Subsection (a) [(a)(3)], the <u>advisory</u>
- 20 committee, under direction of the commission, may contact and
- 21 cooperate with:
- 22 (1) existing public or private Holocaust or other
- 23 genocide resource organizations, including the United States
- 24 Holocaust Memorial Museum;
- 25 (2) other museums, centers, and organizations based in
- 26 this state;
- 27 (3) state agencies that carry out the educational

- 1 functions of the state delegated under the Education Code,
- 2 including the Texas Education Agency and the Texas Higher Education
- 3 Coordinating Board; [and]
- 4 (4) the Texas Veterans Commission; and
- 5 <u>(5)</u> members of the United States Congress and of the 6 legislature of this state.
- 7 (c) The commission shall adopt rules as necessary governing
- 8 the operation of the advisory committee [for its own procedures].
- 9 The rules may include the delegation of certain final decisions and
- 10 <u>authorities</u> to the advisory committee that are appropriate given
- 11 the committee's advisory status.
- 12 (d) [The commission may appoint advisory committees to advise the commission.
- 14 [(e)] The commission, in coordination with the advisory
- 15 committee, shall adopt rules, policies, and procedures for the [may
- 16 provide] matching grants program established to assist in the
- 17 implementation of the [commission's] goals and objectives of this
- 18 chapter. The commission must prescribe for the program an annual
- 19 budget, a funding cycle, goals, award eligibility criteria, grant
- 20 application and selection processes, requirements for in-kind
- 21 services and matching fund waivers, maximum grant awards, conflict
- 22 of interest policies, data collection and evaluation, and audits of
- 23 grant recipients.
- SECTION 17. Section 449.053, Government Code, is amended to
- 25 read as follows:
- Sec. 449.053. FUNDING. (a) The commission may accept gifts
- 27 and grants from a public or private source on behalf of the advisory

- 1 <u>committee</u> for the <u>advisory committee</u> [commission] to use in
- 2 performing the [commission's powers and] duties assigned to the
- 3 <u>advisory committee</u> under this chapter. The commission may
- 4 participate in the establishment and operation of an affiliated
- 5 nonprofit organization whose purpose is to raise funds for or
- 6 provide services or other benefits to the <u>advisory committee</u>
- 7 [commission].
- 8 (b) All legislative appropriations to [The Texas Historical
- 9 Commission may provide staff and may support the functions and
- 10 activities of the <u>advisory committee</u> shall be made as part of the
- 11 commission's legislative appropriations request process and
- 12 disbursed to the commission [Texas Holocaust and Genocide
- 13 Commission from money available to the Texas Historical Commission
- 14 that may be used for this purpose. The legislature may also
- 15 specifically appropriate money to the Texas Historical Commission
- 16 to provide staff and to otherwise support functions and activities
- 17 of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission].
- 18 SECTION 18. Subchapter B, Chapter 449, Government Code, is
- 19 amended by adding Section 449.054 to read as follows:
- Sec. 449.054. COMMISSION REPORT; AUDITS. (a) The commission
- 21 <u>shall include the activities of the advisory committee as</u>
- 22 <u>authorized</u> by Section 449.052 in the report the commission is
- 23 required to submit under Section 442.005(n).
- 24 (b) The advisory committee is subject to audit and
- 25 evaluation by the commission or another appropriate state agency,
- 26 including the state auditor's office.
- 27 SECTION 19. Section 29.9072(c), Education Code, is amended

- 1 to read as follows:
- 2 (c) Holocaust Remembrance Week shall include
- 3 age-appropriate instruction, as determined by each school
- 4 district. Instruction shall include:
- 5 (1) information about the history of and lessons
- 6 learned from the Holocaust;
- 7 (2) participation, in person or using technology, in
- 8 learning projects about the Holocaust; and
- 9 (3) the use of materials developed or approved by the
- 10 Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee [Commission].
- 11 SECTION 20. The following provisions of the Government Code
- 12 are repealed:
- 13 (1) Section 449.003;
- 14 (2) Section 449.006; and
- 15 (3) Section 449.051.
- SECTION 21. (a) On the effective date of this Act, a public
- 17 member of the former Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission
- 18 becomes a member of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory
- 19 Committee and continues the member's term on the advisory committee
- 20 in accordance with the original appointment on the commission.
- 21 (b) Section 449.0115, Government Code, as added by this Act,
- 22 applies to a member of the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory
- 23 Committee appointed before, on, or after the effective date of this
- 24 Act.
- 25 (c) Not later than September 1, 2021, the Texas Historical
- 26 Commission and the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee
- 27 shall develop and enter into a memorandum of understanding as

- 1 required by Section 449.0515, Government Code, as added by this
- 2 Act. Before the effective date of this Act, the Texas Historical
- 3 Commission and Texas Holocaust and Genocide Commission may begin
- 4 developing the memorandum of understanding.
- 5 (d) Not later than December 1, 2022, the Texas Historical
- 6 Commission and the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee
- 7 shall provide a written report to the Sunset Advisory Commission on
- 8 the progress of the Texas Historical Commission and the Texas
- 9 Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee in implementing the
- 10 changes in law made by this Act. The report must identify any
- 11 obstacles or concerns encountered in implementing the changes.
- 12 (e) All contracts and agreements of the Texas Holocaust and
- 13 Genocide Commission are continued in effect as contracts and
- 14 agreements of the Texas Historical Commission.
- 15 (f) The Texas Historical Commission shall coordinate with
- 16 the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory Committee and the
- 17 Legislative Budget Board to propose goals, strategies, and
- 18 performance measures for the advisory committee in the commission's
- 19 legislative appropriations request for the state fiscal biennium
- 20 ending August 31, 2025.
- 21 SECTION 22. As soon as practicable after the effective date
- 22 of this Act, the Texas Historical Commission shall perform an
- 23 evaluation of the job titles and salaries of personnel employed by
- 24 the commission to support the Texas Holocaust and Genocide Advisory
- 25 Committee under Section 449.012, Government Code, as amended by
- 26 this Act, in order to ensure that the salaries and titles are
- 27 commensurate with other commission employees with comparable

- 1 duties.
- 2 SECTION 23. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
