BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF TEXAS: 6 ARTICLE 1. STATE ANATOMICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE; TEXAS FUNERAL 7 SERVICE COMMISSION 8 SECTION 1.01. The heading to Chapter 691, Health and Safety 9 Code, is amended to read as follows: 10 11 CHAPTER 691. DONATION OF BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS 12 [ANATOMICAL BOARD OF THE STATE OF TEXAS] SECTION 1.02. The heading to Subchapter A, Chapter 691, 13 Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 14 SUBCHAPTER A. GENERAL <u>PROVISIONS; STATE</u> [ORGANIZATION OF] 15 ANATOMICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE [BOARD OF THE STATE OF TEXAS] 16 SECTION 1.03. Section 691.001, Health and Safety Code, is 17 amended by amending Subdivision (1) and adding Subdivisions (4) and 18 (5) to read as follows: 19 20 (1)"Advisory committee [Board]" means the State 21 Anatomical Advisory Committee [Board of the State of Texas]. 22 (4) "Commission" means the Texas Funeral Service 23 Commission. 24 (5) "Willed body program" means a program operated at

1 an institution of higher education in this state and approved by the commission that allows a living individual to donate the 2 individual's body or anatomical specimen for educational or 3 4 research purposes. 5 SECTION 1.04. Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows: 6 Sec. 691.002. ADVISORY COMMITTEE [COMPOSITION OF BOARD]. 7 8 (a) The State Anatomical Advisory Committee is established to advise the commission on matters related to the regulation and 9 10 operation of willed body programs in this state. (b) The advisory committee is composed of representatives 11 12 appointed by the commission from institutions of higher education that operate willed body programs [The Anatomical Board of the 13 14 State of Texas is composed of one representative from each school or 15 college of chiropractic, osteopathy, medicine, or dentistry incorporated in this state]. 16 17 (c) Members of the advisory committee serve two-year terms [(b) On March 1 of each odd-numbered year, the chief executive 18 19 officer of each institution described by Subsection (a) shall 20 appoint as the institution's representative on the board one professor of surgery or of basic anatomical sciences who is 21 associated with the institution]. 2.2 23 (d) [(c)] Appointments to the advisory committee [board]

23 <u>(a)</u> [(c)] Appointments to the <u>advisory committee</u> [board] 24 shall be made without regard to the race, creed, sex, religion, or 25 national origin of the appointees.

26 (e) Sections 2110.002 and 2110.008, Government Code, do not
 27 apply to the advisory committee.

SECTION 1.05. Section 691.007(c), Health and Safety Code, is redesignated as Section 691.011, Health and Safety Code, and amended to read as follows:

<u>Sec. 691.011. RECORDS.</u> [(c)] The <u>commission</u> [board] shall keep identification records of each body donated to the <u>commission</u> [board] and of each body or anatomical specimen distributed by the commission [board].

8 SECTION 1.06. Section 691.008(a), Health and Safety Code, 9 is redesignated as Section 691.012, Health and Safety Code, and 10 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.012. FEES. [(a)] The <u>commission</u> [board] may set and collect reasonable and necessary fees for:

13 <u>(1)</u> receiving and distributing bodies and anatomical 14 specimens; and

15 (2) conducting inspections of institutions or other 16 persons authorized to receive and use bodies or anatomical 17 specimens under this chapter.

18 SECTION 1.07. Section 691.010, Health and Safety Code, is 19 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.010. PUBLIC INFORMATION AND 20 PARTICIPATION; 21 COMPLAINTS. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall prepare information of public interest describing the functions of the commission under 22 this chapter [board] and the commission's [board's] procedures by 23 24 which complaints are filed with and resolved by the commission The commission [board] shall make the information 25 [board]. 26 available to the public and appropriate state agencies.

27 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] by rule shall establish methods

by which service recipients can be notified of the name, mailing address, and telephone number of the <u>commission</u> [board] for the purpose of directing complaints to the <u>commission</u> [board]. The <u>commission</u> [board] may provide for that notification by including the information on each written contract relating to bodies willed or donated to an entity regulated by the <u>commission</u> [board] or authorized by the commission [board] to receive bodies.

8 (c) The commission [board] shall keep an information file about each complaint filed with the commission [board] relating to 9 10 its functions under this chapter. If a written complaint is filed with the <u>commission</u> [board] relating to a person or an entity 11 12 regulated by the commission under this chapter [board], the commission [board, at least as frequently as quarterly and until 13 14 final disposition of the complaint, shall periodically notify the 15 parties to the complaint of the status of the complaint until final 16 disposition unless notice would jeopardize an undercover 17 investigation.

18 (d) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall develop and implement 19 policies that provide the public with a reasonable opportunity to 20 appear before the <u>commission</u> [board] and to speak on any issue under 21 the jurisdiction of the <u>commission</u> [board].

22 SECTION 1.08. Section 691.022, Health and Safety Code, is 23 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.022. GENERAL DUTIES. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall distribute bodies and anatomical specimens to institutions <u>of</u> <u>higher education that operate willed body programs</u> and other <u>institutions and</u> persons authorized to receive <u>a body or specimen</u>

1 under this chapter [them].

2 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall adopt rules to ensure that 3 each body and anatomical specimen <u>is treated with respect while</u> in 4 the custody of the <u>commission</u> [board] or an institution <u>or person</u> 5 <u>authorized to receive the body or specimen, including an</u> 6 <u>institution of higher education that operates a willed body program</u> 7 [represented on the board is treated with respect].

8 (c) The commission may not adopt a rule related to standards of practice, ethics, qualifications, or disciplinary sanctions for 9 institutions or persons regulated under this chapter unless the 10 advisory committee first proposes the rule and the proposed rule is 11 12 authorized by this chapter. The commission may not modify a rule described by this subsection that is proposed by the advisory 13 committee. If the commission declines to adopt a rule proposed by 14 15 the advisory committee, the commission shall return the rule to the advisory committee with an explanation of the reasons the 16 17 commission declined to adopt the rule.

18 (d) The commission shall adopt rules, establish procedures, 19 and prescribe forms necessary to administer and enforce this 20 chapter.

21 SECTION 1.09. Section 691.0225, Health and Safety Code, is 22 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.0225. INFORMATIONAL DOCUMENT. The <u>commission</u> [board] shall develop a document to inform a person making a gift of a decedent's body or anatomical specimen for purposes of education, including forensic science education, or research of the risks and benefits associated with donation. The <u>commission</u> [board] shall

1 make the document available on the <u>commission's</u> [board's] Internet
2 website.

3 SECTION 1.10. Section 691.023, Health and Safety Code, is 4 amended to read as follows:

5 Sec. 691.023. DUTY TO DELIVER CERTAIN BODIES TO <u>COMMISSION</u> 6 [BOARD]. (a) An officer, employee, or representative of the state, 7 of a political subdivision, or of an institution having charge or 8 control of a body not claimed for burial or a body required to be 9 buried at public expense shall:

10 (1) notify the <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> 11 [board's] representative of the body's existence when the body 12 comes into the person's possession, charge, or control if notified 13 in writing to do so by the <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> 14 [board's] representative;

15 (2) deliver the body in accordance with the direction
16 of the <u>commission</u> [board]; and

(3) allow the <u>commission</u> [board], the <u>commission's</u> [board's] representative, or a physician designated by the <u>commission</u> [board] who complies with this chapter to remove the body to be used for the advancement of medical or forensic science.

(b) If the <u>commission</u> [board] does not require a political subdivision or agency of the political subdivision to deliver a body under this section, the political subdivision shall pay all costs of preparation for burial, including costs of embalming.

25 SECTION 1.11. Section 691.025(c), Health and Safety Code, 26 is amended to read as follows:

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(c) A body that is not claimed for burial within 48 hours

1 after a relative receives notification shall be delivered as soon 2 as possible to the <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> [board's] 3 representative.

4 SECTION 1.12. Section 691.026, Health and Safety Code, is 5 amended to read as follows:

6 Sec. 691.026. BODY OF TRAVELER. If an unclaimed body is the 7 body of a traveler who died suddenly, the <u>commission</u> [board] shall 8 direct the institution or other person receiving the body to retain 9 the body for six months for purposes of identification.

SECTION 1.13. Section 691.027, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.027. AUTOPSY. Only the <u>commission</u> [board] may grant permission to perform an autopsy on an unclaimed body. The <u>commission</u> [board] may grant permission after receiving a specific request for an autopsy that shows sufficient evidence of medical urgency.

SECTION 1.14. Section 691.028(a), Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

(a) An adult living in this state who is of sound mind may donate the adult's body by will or other written instrument to the <u>commission</u> [board], a medical or dental school, or another donee authorized by the <u>commission</u> [board,] to be used for the advancement of medical or forensic science.

24 SECTION 1.15. Section 691.029, Health and Safety Code, is 25 amended to read as follows:

26 Sec. 691.029. AUTHORITY TO ACCEPT BODIES FROM OUTSIDE THE 27 STATE. The <u>commission</u> [board] may receive a body transported to the

1 <u>commission</u> [board] from outside this state.

2 SECTION 1.16. Section 691.030, Health and Safety Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.030. COMMISSION'S [BOARD'S] AUTHORITY ТО 4 5 DISTRIBUTE BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS. (a) The commission [board] or the commission's [board's] representative 6 shall distribute bodies donated to it and may redistribute bodies donated 7 8 to medical or dental schools or other donees authorized by the commission [board] to: 9

10 (1) schools and colleges of chiropractic, osteopathy,
11 medicine, or dentistry incorporated in this state;

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(2) forensic science programs;

(3) search and rescue organizations or recovery teams that are recognized by the <u>commission</u> [board], are exempt from federal taxation under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, and use human remains detection canines with the authorization of a local or county law enforcement agency;

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(4) physicians; and

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(5) other persons as provided by this section.

(b) In making the distribution, the <u>commission</u> [board]
shall give priority to the schools and colleges that need bodies for
lectures and demonstrations.

(c) If the <u>commission</u> [board] has remaining bodies, the <u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> [board's] representative shall distribute or redistribute those bodies to the schools and colleges proportionately and equitably according to the number of students in each school or college receiving instruction or

1 demonstration in normal or morbid anatomy and operative surgery.
2 The dean of each school or college shall certify that number to the
3 <u>commission</u> [board] when required by the <u>commission</u> [board].

4 (d) The <u>commission</u> [board] may transport a body or 5 anatomical specimen to an authorized recipient in another state if 6 the <u>commission</u> [board] determines that the supply of bodies or 7 anatomical specimens in this state exceeds the need for bodies or 8 anatomical specimens in this state and if:

9 (1) the deceased donated <u>the deceased's</u> [his] body in 10 compliance with Section 691.028 and at the time of the donation 11 authorized the <u>commission</u> [board] to transport the body outside 12 this state; or

13 (2) the body was donated in compliance with Chapter 14 692A and the person authorized to make the donation under Section 15 692A.009 authorized the <u>commission</u> [board] to transport the body 16 outside this state.

SECTION 1.17. Sections 691.031(a), (b), and (f), Health and Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall adopt rules to ensure that:
(1) each body or anatomical specimen received or
distributed by the <u>commission</u> [board] is properly transported;

(2) a label with the statement "CONTENTS DERIVED FROM
 DONATED HUMAN TISSUE" is affixed to the container in which the body
 or anatomical specimen is transported; and

(3) each person who has control or possession of a bodyor anatomical specimen:

27 (A) satisfactorily completes the information

1 required on a chain-of-custody form prescribed by the <u>commission</u>
2 [board];

3 (B) maintains a copy of the form for the person's4 records; and

5 (C) transfers the form to any other person to 6 whom control or possession of the body or anatomical specimen is 7 transferred.

8 (b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may employ a public carrier to 9 transport bodies or anatomical specimens received or distributed by 10 the <u>commission</u> [board].

(f) The sender and receiver of each body or anatomical specimen shall file the records required under this section in accordance with <u>commission</u> [board] rules so that the <u>commission</u> [board] or a district or county attorney may inspect the records at any time.

SECTION 1.18. Section 691.032, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

Sec. 691.032. COSTS OF DISTRIBUTION. А 18 person or institution receiving a body or anatomical specimen under this 19 chapter shall pay in a manner specified by the commission [board], 20 or as otherwise agreed on, all costs incurred in distributing the 21 body or anatomical specimen so that the state, a county, a 22 municipality, or an officer, employee, or representative of the 23 24 state, a county, or a municipality does not incur any expense.

25 SECTION 1.19. Sections 691.033(a), (b), and (d), Health and 26 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

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(a) To further medical or forensic science, a school,

1 college, or person designated by the <u>commission</u> [board] may use,
2 dissect, operate on, examine, and experiment on a body or
3 anatomical specimen distributed under this chapter.

(b) A school, college, or person shall keep a permanent
record of each body or anatomical specimen received from the
<u>commission</u> [board] or the <u>commission's</u> [board's] representative.
The record must be sufficient to identify the body or anatomical
specimen and may be inspected by the <u>commission</u> [board] or the
<u>commission's</u> [board's] representative.

10 (d) To aid prosecutions under Section 42.08, Penal Code, the 11 <u>commission</u> [board] shall adopt rules that clearly state the 12 activities that are authorized by the <u>commission</u> [board] in 13 relation to the use or dissection of a body.

SECTION 1.20. Section 691.034, Health and Safety Code, is amended to read as follows:

16 Sec. 691.034. REGULATION OF PERSONS AND INSTITUTIONS USING 17 BODIES AND ANATOMICAL SPECIMENS. (a) The <u>commission</u> [board] shall 18 inspect and may approve institutions and other persons for the 19 receipt and use of bodies and anatomical specimens under this 20 chapter.

(b) The <u>commission</u> [board] may investigate a person or institution if the <u>commission</u> [board] has reason to believe that the person or institution has improperly used a body or anatomical specimen.

(c) The <u>commission</u> [board] may suspend or revoke a person's
or institution's authorization to receive and use or dissect bodies
or anatomical specimens if the <u>commission</u> [board] determines that

1 the person or institution has improperly used a body or anatomical 2 specimen.

3 (d) A person or institution is entitled to a hearing before the commission [board] or a hearing examiner appointed by the 4 5 commission [board] before the commission [board] may revoke the person's or institution's authorization to receive and use or 6 dissect bodies or anatomical specimens. The commission [board] 7 8 shall make all final decisions to suspend or revoke an 9 authorization.

SECTION 1.21. Subchapter A, Chapter 651, Occupations Code, is amended by adding Section 651.005 to read as follows:

12 <u>Sec. 651.005. REGULATION OF WILLED BODY PROGRAMS. The</u> 13 commission shall regulate willed body programs as provided by 14 <u>Chapter 691, Health and Safety Code, and in accordance with the</u> 15 <u>powers and duties granted by this chapter to the extent necessary to</u> 16 <u>regulate the programs under that chapter.</u>

SECTION 1.22. The following provisions of the Health andSafety Code are repealed:

Section 691.003; 19 (1) 20 (2) Section 691.004; Section 691.005; 21 (3) Section 691.006; 22 (4) Sections 691.007(a), (b), and (d); 23 (5) 24 (6) Sections 691.008(b) and (d); the headings to Sections 691.007 and 691.008; and 25 (7) Section 691.009. 26 (8)

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ARTICLE 2. CONFORMING AMENDMENTS

2 SECTION 2.01. Article 43.25, Code of Criminal Procedure, is 3 amended to read as follows:

4 Art. 43.25. BODY OF CONVICT. The body of a convict who has been legally executed shall be embalmed immediately and so directed 5 by the Director of the correctional institutions division of the 6 Texas Department of Criminal Justice [Department of Corrections]. 7 8 If the body is not demanded or requested by a relative or bona fide friend within forty-eight hours after execution then it shall be 9 delivered to the Texas Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board 10 of the State of Texas], if requested by the commission [Board]. If 11 the body is requested by a relative, \underline{a} bona fide friend, or the 12 Texas Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of 13 14 Texas], such recipient shall pay a fee [of] not to exceed 15 twenty-five dollars to the mortician for the mortician's [his] services in embalming the body for which the mortician shall issue 16 17 to the recipient a written receipt. When such receipt is delivered to the Director of the correctional institutions division of the 18 19 Texas Department of Criminal Justice [Department of Corrections], the body of the deceased shall be delivered to the party named in 20 the receipt or the party's [his] authorized agent. If the body is 21 not delivered to a relative, a bona fide friend, or the Texas 22 Funeral Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of 23 24 Texas], the Director of the correctional institutions division of the Texas Department of Criminal Justice [Department of 25 26 Corrections] shall cause the body to be decently buried, and the fee for embalming shall be paid by the county in which the indictment 27

1 which resulted in conviction was found.

2 SECTION 2.02. Section 404.093(b), Government Code, is 3 amended to read as follows:

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(b) This subchapter does not apply to:

5 (1) funds pledged to the payment of bonds, notes, or 6 other debts if the funds are not otherwise required to be deposited 7 in the treasury;

8 (2) funds held in trust or escrow for the benefit of a 9 person or entity other than a state agency;

10 (3) funds set apart out of earnings derived from 11 investment of funds held in trust for others, as administrative 12 expenses of the trustee agency; <u>or</u>

13 (4) funds, grants, donations, and proceeds from funds, 14 grants, and donations, given in trust to the Texas State Library and 15 Archives Commission for the establishment and maintenance of 16 regional historical resource depositories and libraries in 17 accordance with Section 441.154[; or

18 [(5) funds under the management of the 19 secretary=treasurer of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas, 20 as provided by Section 691.008, Health and Safety Code].

21 SECTION 2.03. Sections 692A.011(a), (b), and (c), Health and 22 Safety Code, are amended to read as follows:

(a) An anatomical gift may be made to the following personsnamed in the document of gift:

(1) an organ procurement organization to be used fortransplantation, therapy, research, or education;

27 (2) a hospital to be used for research;

1 (3) subject to Subsection (d), an individual 2 designated by the person making the anatomical gift if the 3 individual is the recipient of the part;

4 (4) an eye bank or tissue bank, except that use of a
5 gift of a whole body must be coordinated through the <u>Texas Funeral</u>
6 <u>Service Commission</u> [<u>Anatomical Board of the State of Texas</u>];

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(5) a forensic science program at:

8 (A) a general academic teaching institution as9 defined by Section 61.003, Education Code; or

(B) a private or independent institution of
higher education as defined by Section 61.003, Education Code;

12 (6) a search and rescue organization or recovery team 13 that is recognized by the <u>Texas Funeral Service Commission</u> 14 [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas], is exempt from federal 15 taxation under Section 501(c)(3), Internal Revenue Code of 1986, 16 and uses human remains detection canines with the authorization of 17 a local or county law enforcement agency; or

18 (7) the <u>Texas Funeral Service Commission</u> [Anatomical
 19 Board of the State of Texas].

(b) Except for donations described by Subsections (a)(1) through (6), the <u>Texas Funeral Service Commission</u> [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas] shall be the donee of gifts of bodies or parts of bodies made for the purpose of education or research that are subject to distribution by the <u>commission</u> [board] under Chapter 691.

(c) A forensic science program that receives a donation
 under Subsection (a)(5) must submit a report to the <u>Texas Funeral</u>

1 Service Commission [Anatomical Board of the State of Texas] on a
2 quarterly basis that lists:

3 (1) the number of bodies or parts of bodies that the4 program received; and

5 (2) the method in which the program used the bodies or6 parts of bodies for education or research.

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ARTICLE 3. TRANSITIONS AND EFFECTIVE DATE

8 SECTION 3.01. (a) The Anatomical Board of the State of Texas is abolished but continues in existence until September 1, 2022, 9 10 for the sole purpose of transferring obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties to the Texas Funeral Service Commission. The 11 Texas Funeral Service Commission assumes all of the obligations, 12 property, rights, powers, and duties of the Anatomical Board of the 13 14 State of Texas as they exist immediately before the effective date 15 of this Act. All unexpended and unobligated funds under the management of the secretary-treasurer of the Anatomical Board of 16 17 the State of Texas, as provided by Section 691.008, Health and Safety Code, as that section existed immediately before the 18 19 effective date of this Act, are transferred to the general revenue fund for the purpose of the Texas Funeral Service Commission 20 administering duties under Chapter 691, Health and Safety Code, as 21 amended by this Act. 22

(b) The Anatomical Board of the State of Texas and the Texas Funeral Service Commission shall, in consultation with appropriate state entities, ensure that the transfer of the obligations, property, rights, powers, and duties of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas to the Texas Funeral Service Commission is completed

1 not later than September 1, 2022.

(c) All rules of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas 2 are continued in effect as rules of the Texas Funeral Service 3 Commission until superseded by a rule of the Texas Funeral Service 4 5 Commission. An authorization issued by the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas is continued in effect as provided by the law in 6 effect immediately before the effective date of this Act. 7 An 8 authorization pending on the effective date of this Act is continued without change in status after the effective date of this 9 10 Act. A complaint, investigation, or other proceeding pending on the effective date of this Act is continued without change in status 11 after the effective date of this Act. 12

13 (d) Unless the context indicates otherwise, a reference to 14 the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas in a law or 15 administrative rule means the Texas Funeral Service Commission.

16 SECTION 3.02. (a) Not later than the 60th day after the 17 effective date of this Act, the Texas Funeral Service Commission 18 shall appoint members to the State Anatomical Advisory Committee in 19 accordance with Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, as amended 20 by this Act.

(b) The members of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas whose terms expire under Section 3.01 of this Act shall continue to provide advice to the Texas Funeral Service Commission until a majority of the members of the State Anatomical Advisory Committee are appointed under Subsection (a) of this section and qualified. A member of the Anatomical Board of the State of Texas described by this subsection may be appointed to the State

Anatomical Advisory Committee if the member is otherwise eligible
 for appointment under Section 691.002, Health and Safety Code, as
 amended by this Act.

4 SECTION 3.03. This Act takes effect September 1, 2021.
